**Traders Cautious Yesterday On Montreal Market**

MONTREAL, Dec. 12 — (CP)— Prices were slightly easier and traders cautious in transactions today on the stock exchange and curb market. Market students suggested investors were waiting to see what will emerge in Wall Street following Monday's sharp advance and subsequent indecisiveness. Papers, industrials and utilities were lower in the indices and banks and golds up.

Down in papers were Abitibi Common, Brown Preferred Consolidated, International, Great Lakes, Price, Bathurst "B", MacLaren, Lake St. John, M. and O., Dopacona and Fraser. Dryden moved up, Brown Preferred lost a gain and B. C. Forest and Abitibi Preferred delisted deficits.

Sherwin-Williams jumped a point following announcement by the company of a bonus for its common stock. In other industrials, higher were Gypsum, D. Bridge, G. Industries and Electrolix. Receding were Vickers Common, which opened firmer, Vickers Preferred, Dosco, Tar, M. Locomotive, U. Steel, N. S. C. S. Asbestos, R. Mitchell, C. Sugar, C. Car "A" and H. Bridge. Celanese backed up in textiles. Lower in liquors were C. Breweries, McEon, Alco "A" and "B" Walker and U. Distillers. Seagrams was off temporarily.

I. Power, Ottawa Power and Quebec Power improved in utilities and Shawinigan and Shawinigan were easier. National and Scotia pushed up in banks. Commerce ceded a rise and Montreal cancelled a slip. C. P. R. and Commercial Transport lagged in carriers.

Noranda was unsteady in metals and Smelters recovered from a stumble. B. A. and Petroleum inch ed back in refiners. Placer was better and Pato off in golds.

Among junior mines, ahead at the bell were Sullivan, softer for a time, E. Sullivan, C. Cadillac, Nechu, Formaque and Stadacona. Perron, Sherwin and Santiago were in loss territory.

Chalking up gains in miscellaneous were Acceptance, Davis "B" and Lowney while in arrears were Lithograph, G. Bunkers, Famous Players, West Gram, Chemicals and Silk.

**N. Y. Stock Market Suffers Setback**

NEW YORK, Dec. 12 — (AP)— The stock market dropped today in the first decisive setback of the week. Losses ranged from fractions on around 4 points. Hardest hit were steel, motors and rails shares.

A handful of issues clung to modest gains, scoring during morning irregularity but the bulk of the market finished at or only a shade above the lowest levels of the day.

Canadian stocks shed fractions. Biggest loser was Canadian Pacific down 1-2. Dome Mines, Dissillers Seagym and Hiram Walker each dropped 1-8. On the curb both Lake Shore and Giant Yellowknife were unchanged.

U. S. Gypsum topped weakness. Its decline of nearly 6 points with an additional loss of 7 1-8 at 101.

Other notable losers included U. S. Steel at 71 3-4, Bethlehem at 91 1-2, General Motors 53, Chrysler 86 1-4, Union Pacific 128 1-2, General Electric 53 3-8, Schenley 58 3-4, American Can 87 1-2, Air Reduction 35 1-4, J. I. Case 36, Montgomery Ward 63 1-2, Douglas Aircraft 70, and Santa Fe 95 1-2.

Among the gainers were Goodrich, Woolworth, International Harvester, Columbia Gas and Electric, Allied Chemical and T. Gas Co.
