FINANCIAL NEWS BRIEFS

(Received over Pitfield and Co's Private Wire)

TORONTO, Dec. 16—Calgary Wres—Commish Pete commenced running production tubing yesterday morning. The potential flow through 6 5/8 inch casing is more than 1200 barrels daily and the tubing is expected to boost the flow considerably. The well will be acidized soon.

Brown Corp.—No. 3 is making fair time below 6,320 feet with the time contact expected in about another 80 feet of drilling. Brown No. 4 below 3,285 feet. Royalty No. 28 being drilled jointly by Royalty and the C. and E. Corp. is making fast time below 4,375 feet. Another west flank will be on the last drive. West Flank No. 1 is making good time and is expected to contact the Madison Lime contact at any time. West Flank No. 3 is meanwhile drilling 235 feet in the time, within a few days of completion. West Flank No. 1 first of the group completed is expected to start its official production test this morning—Wednesday—figures may be available Thursday.

NEW YORK, Dec. 16—A coalition of Republican and Democratic senators have started a campaign which in their opinion will help business. The first plan announced was a ten point program. Some of the leading senators mentioned in this connection are Byrd, Van Denburg, Burke, Bailey, Tuding and others. Yesterday's market gave a rather good performance and we would expect some extension of the rally. Coppers, steels, and oils acted about as well as any section of the list yesterday. The following are the first three paragraphs to "precede the above". American stocks are high in London and American today. The only news of interest is political. The House debated the Wage and Hour Bill proposed by the American Federation of Labor Secretary Wallace criticized moves to fix farm prices.

MONTREAL, Dec. 16—Parke Davis and Co. declares dividend of 50 cents payable January 3 record Dec. 22. Governors of New York Stock Exchange have approved a new schedule of commission rates designed to yield approximately 1 1/2 per cent more revenue than prevailing rates, which have been in effect since October 30, 1924. Proposed new schedule now goes to the membership of the exchange for a vote December 22.

MONTREAL, Dec. 16—U. S. Power Output—For week ended Dec. 11 decreased 2.1 per cent. Jones and Laughlin Steel Prod dividend passed.

Canada Bud Breweries—Earnings for year to date reported as more than sufficient to cover dividends of 80 cents declared this year.

Shawinigan—To pay 5 cents extra in addition to regular quarterly dividend of 20 cents on February 15 to holders of record Jan. 25.

Thompson Cadillac—Additional 40,000 shares issued at 37 1/2 cents leaving 343,000 shares outstanding.

Steel Operations—Starting at 24 per cent of capacity Monday were raised to 25 per cent yesterday in Pittsburgh.

American Metal Market—Forecasts that ingot output this week will be unchanged from last week and opinion expressed that leveling off at this time of year is promising sign.

Willis Overland—Plant at Cleveland closing to an indefinite date at January 2 affecting about 4,000 employees.

General Motors—Sales overseas to dealers in November gained 1.2 per cent over November 1936 and for the 11 months increased 13 1/2 per cent.

Grain Prices

WINNIPEG, Dec. 16—(CP)—Wheat futures on Winnipeg grain exchange which have averaged higher almost every day in two weeks nosed-dived late today in sympathy with a slump at Chicago. Profit-taking and back-spreading seeped into the market after futures registered gains of more than a cent in early transactions. Final quotations were 1 1/2-3 1/2 cents under yesterday's final prices, Dec at 1 26 1/2-2, May 1 17 1/2-3 1/2, and July 1 11 1/2-1 12 1/2. Premiums on Nos. 1 and 2 northern wheat advanced 1/2 cent to 21 1/2 and 17 1/2 above the May future. Scarcity of offerings accounted for a dull trade. Coarse grain futures eased in sympathy with wheat, oats closed unchanged to 1-4 lower, barley 1-2-3-4 lower, fax 1-8-3-4 lower and rye 1-1-2.
