The funeral of the late Mr. Fanning will take place Wednesday morning at nine o'clock to the R. C. Cemetery.

He was born in the county of Monaghan, Ireland in 1812 and came to this country in 1841 arriving at Charlottetown in the ship Thomas Gleason. After two or three years residence at the capital he moved to Kinkora and in 1866 came to Summerside where he has since resided. The late Mr. Fanning always enjoyed good health and was remarkably smart for his age. Surviving him are four sons: John in Oklahoma, Patrick T. in Summerside, James at Coleman, Joseph in Montreal, Frank in Exeter, New Hampshire, and the daughters Mrs. Harry Hester, St. Paul, Minn., Mrs. John T. McNally, Summerside and Mrs. John Murphy, Charlottetown.
