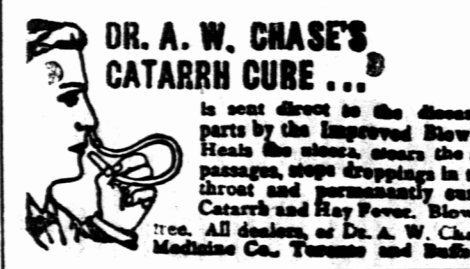

CAPT T. W. READ, of this town has been appointed by the Dominion Government to take charge of the Chicken Fattening Station which will be opened at Summerside next week. The chickens are to be kept in specially constructed coops which are now being built by the Mechanics' Mfg. Co. In these they will be fed about one month, after which they will be killed dressed and packed, then shipped via Charlottetown, in cold storage for the European markets. For the first shipment Mr. Read will buy about 200 chickens, averaging from two to three lbs. each for which he will pay from 30 to 40 cents per pair. Any farmers interested in this new industry who have chickens to dispose of will call on Mr. Read as early as possible.
