"Hook Night" at Fairyland tonight. The mail train arrived on Saturday at 3.30. Capt. Joseph Read arrived in the City yesterday. J. B. Hegon left last night on a trip to Ottawa. D. P. McNutt, Malpeque, was in the City Saturday. Miss McRae left for Boston last night, by way of Georgetown. The mail special brought in one hundred bags of mail Saturday. James Peters leaves this evening for St. John to join the railway survey. There were thirty passengers to Georgetown by the Stanley Saturday. Wm. Sellars was a passenger by the mail train last night on his way to Halifax. Owing to the heavy ice the Stanley did not get into Georgetown Saturday until 1.10. The record sale of musical instruments, etc., by Miller Bros. will be continued this week. Further particulars tomorrow. The Minto was delayed on Saturday by the heavy ice and did not get into Lunenburg until 1.45. The freight by the Stanley yesterday included one car seed, one car tin, two cars mixed freight. The outward cargo by the Minto Saturday included 241 packages mixed freight and 1705 bags oats. So far ten candidates for amateur honors have entered for the Fairyland contest tonight. There will be fun to burn. The funeral of the late Mrs. W. P. Yeo who died at Lloydminster, Sask., of inflammation of the brain, will take place from her former residence, Carleton, on Wednesday, March 11th at 2 p.m. The fire alarm sounded about eleven last night for a slight fire in the cellar of J. Pranty's house, near the gas works. The firemen turned out but the fire was extinguished before any damage was done. The Sydney Hockey Club arrived in this City Saturday by the mail train and are registered at the Victoria. On Friday night last they played in New Glasgow and tomorrow and Wednesday night they will play in the Arena here, the Abergweits on Tuesday and Victorias on Wednesday. The team will then proceed to Fredericton where they will play for the Star trophy. An order to "move on," given by police Hooper on Saturday night to a man who was loitering near the old London House corner, Queen Street, was responded to by the man striking the policeman. He was arrested but it took some time and a couple more policemen to do it, and a big crowd gathered during the excitement. The rest of the story will be told at the City Police Court this morning. A bad fire broke out about midnight Friday night in the Post Office at O'Leary and destroyed four buildings before being got under control and the contents of the Post Office excepting the money and registered letters which the postmaster, Robt. Ellis, Sr., takes home with him. The three buildings next to the Post Office occupied respectively by Harry Turner as a harness shop, Dr. McDougall's office and the O'Leary Drugstore were destroyed, but the contents were all saved. The post office was owned by Robt. Ellis, loss about \$200, no insurance. The other three buildings were owned by W. H. Dennis, O'Leary, loss about \$700 and no insurance.
