ALL NEWS OF LOCAL INTEREST

MAIL arrived at 4:15 on Saturday.

The Farming World of Toronto writing of a prominent Island institution says: Many of the farmers sell the milk at the Charlottetown Condensed Milk Factory. This factory has a capacity of 10,000 lbs. of milk per day, and about 20 hours are employed in it. The average price paid throughout the year is \$1.11 per cwt. One farmer brings in milk regularly all winter to the value of \$4.00 per day, and is paid \$1.12 every month. The demand for the condensed milk, cream, and coffee is rapidly increasing. Strict cleanliness is observed throughout every department of the factory.

A NUMBER of invited guests assembled at the home of John and Mrs. Horde, Winsloe South on Saturday evening last to spend a few hours with them in enjoyment and sociability. The evening was passed very pleasantly in games and amusements and music, both instrumental and vocal. The wants of the inner man were not forgotten; all were called to the dining room where they did ample justice to the sumptuous repast prepared by the hostess in her usual good way. As midnight approached, all repaired to their homes, delighted with the good time, but somewhat disappointed that the day of rest had come.

Business in the Cape says the Agriculturalists have been very brisk lately. On Wednesday last one hundred and seven tons crossed. This represented no less than 11 by nine passengers and on Thursday there were nearly as many more. If the Government would have their boats built lighter, they could be made just as strong and would save the expenditure of considerable unnecessary energy. As we have frequently said there is no branch of the public service so underpaid as the noble fellows who pull the boats across the Capes and we hope the small advance they got a short time ago is only a forerunner of something better to follow.

The students of Boston University are discussing a talk which Professor Marshall T. Derrin, of the university, gave to his class on the subject of indiscriminately sending boys and girls to college. According to the noted educator, a great mistake is made by those parents who, knowing that their children lack brains, still think that they can have them trained to lives of usefulness, by packing them off to a university. Dr. Perrin declared that careful judgment should be used in choosing between practical training and higher education. Among other things he said: Many a boy would do better to stick to the blacksmith shop and many a girl to the millinery trade. Too many feel that going to college is going to redeem their lives. It sometimes ruins them. Some people are no good in college, but all right in other lines. It is much better to be a successful laborer than a tenth-rate minister, a fifteenth rate lawyer or a pretty school marim.

MT. ALLISON NOTES.—The Seniors "At Home" took place on the evening of Feb. 20th. Besides the members of the different Mt Allison Institutions 80 invitations were issued. Needless to say that the magnificent students' residence was decorated and illuminated as richly as money could do it. Numbers of the brightly expariorated study rooms with their brilliant carpeting, glittering ornaments and pictures and innumerable cushions were thrown open as cosy corners. The corridors of the first and second flat through which the guests promenaded were rendered exceedingly attractive by the arrangement of numerous arches of bunting and emblems. Over the first stairway hung the class motto in electric light "Diverso gradu in una" Besides the orchestra there was a delightful programme given by the highest talent in the institutions.—On Saturday evening Rev. Dr. McLean, editor of the Wesleyan, delivered his interesting lecture on the Ethnology of the American Aborigines before the Eucharistarian Society. After the lecture was made an honorary member of the Society.—The Mt. Allison hockey team left this week on a tour to play Canning, Acadia and Windsor.

E. Island, in Everett, Feb. 20, Flora L. Bruce 3-year-old daughter of Dr. John A. Bruce, latter formerly of P. E. Island.

THAT passed peacefully to his reward at Springton on Feb. 9th inst, Donald Nicholson aged 73 years. Deceased was a native of the Isle of Skye, Scotland, and when twelve years of age had emigrated with his parents to Prince Edward Island (P. E. I.) The family first settled in Belfast but shortly afterward removed to Springton where the remaining sixty years of his life were spent. By his death the community has lost one of the oldest, most respected and best known residents. He was a man of a quiet and unassuming nature of a mild and genial disposition. A sincere lover of truth and justice. For upwards of forty-five years he was one of the most active, faithful and consistent members of the Presbyterian Church in Strathalbyn, and his removal from amongst the gray haired venerables of that body has left a vacancy which will long be felt. Deceased had been ill but a few days and his speedy recovery was being hopefully looked for, so that his sudden and unexpected death was a great shock to his family, relations and friends. A sorrowing widow, six sons and five daughters, two sisters and a wide circle of relations are left to mourn. With him they have lost a tender husband and father, a kind brother and a wise counselor. The funeral which took place Wednesday 11th inst, from his home to the Cemetery at Springton was largely attended. The pall bearers were: Alexander McLure, D. A. Nicholson, John K. MacLeod, A. A. Nicholson, Donald McKenzie and Alex. McIntosh. The services were conducted by Rev. J. W. McLean pastor of Strathalbyn. Taking for his text I Cor. 13:4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9. He preached a very impressive discourse to the large number of sorrowing relatives, friends and acquaintances who gathered to pay their last tribute of respect and esteem to one who was widely known, revered and respected.
