## "THE NINETEENTH CENTURY SERIES."

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Volume 1 treats of the Religious Progress of the Century, and is written by W. H. Winthrop, M. A., D. D., F. R. S. C. Dr. Winthrop is one of the leading Methodist ministers in Canada and one of its most cultured writers. He has published many books.

Volume 2, entitled Literature of the Century, is by Prof. A. B. de Mille, M. A., Professor of English Literature in King's College, N. S. H. has a wide distinction both as a writer and a lecturer.

Volume 3 deals with Medicine, Surgery and Hygiene in the Century, and has for its author Ezra Hurlbut Stafford, M. D., formerly of Chicago, now Physician in the Hospital for the Insane, Toronto, and Associate Editor of the Canadian Journal of Medicine and Surgery.

Volume 4 treats of The Progress of India, China and Japan in the Century, and is from the pen of the Right Hon. Sir Richard Temple, Bart., a distinguished scholar, diplomat and statesman.

Volume 5 treats of the Progress of the United States in the Century, and is by Prof. W. P. Trent, M. A., L. L. D., one of the best known younger American historians and critics.

Volume 6 deals with the Continental Rulers of the Century, and has for its author Percy M. Thornton, L. L. B., M. P. for Clapham in the British House of Commons.

Volume 7 is devoted to British Sovereigns of the Century and is from the pen of T. H. S. Escott, M. A. one of the brightest literary lights of London, who succeeded John Morley as editor of the Fortnightly Review.

Volume 8 is entitled Progress of the British Empire in the Century and is from the pen of James Stanley Little, a brilliant man of letters who has been an extensive traveller as well as a voluminous writer.

Volume 9 treats of the progress of Canada in the Century and is from the pen of J. Castell Hopkins, F. R. S. S. one of the best known Canadian writers who is also Fellow of the Royal Society of Literature of London and of many learned societies in Canada and the United States.

All these are by writers of eminence especially qualified to treat the subjects assigned them.

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
