The children of the Mission Band of Grace Church had a very enjoyable garden party on the beautiful grounds of George Carter, Easton Street yesterday afternoon. During the afternoon the children sold ice cream, home made candy and fancy work made by them during the past summer. The party was attended by quite a number of grown up folk who patronized the tables quite extensively. The result of the afternoon's work was that \$10 was realized which will be devoted to the Mission Band work.
WHAT might have resulted in a drowning accident occurred at Victoria Park yesterday afternoon. An individual apparently much under the influence of liquor and accompanied by two chums found his way into the first bathing house near Fort Edward. He became possessed of a desire to worship at the shrine of Neptune and divesting himself of hat and boots only, proceeded out into the briny deep. Everything went well for some time and finally he started for shore again. Before reaching the landing he became exhausted and fell downward in the water. The tide was not very high and he managed to crawl nearly to the landing in an exhausted condition but would have been unable to get up but that one of his companions jumped into the water and helped to lift him out. He was very faint, but recovered after a time, and will perhaps be none the worse for his narrow escape.
Yesterday forenoon a telegram was received from the Bank of British North America at Halifax by their legal agents McLeod and Bentley asking them to have arrested a clerk named William G. Cattarach who was spending his holidays on the Island on a charge of embezzlement from that bank where he had been working. The accused had arrived in the City Thursday by the Halifax and intended leaving at one o'clock yesterday. During the forenoon he had been around the town in the automobile with a party of friends and shortly before one o'clock went down to the Plant Line wharf in it. As he stepped to the ground he was arrested and taken to the station by Sergeant Bradley and Officer Harper where he is now held in custody till further order is received from Halifax. In the afternoon a Guardian representative waited upon Mr. Cattarach at the station but he declined to give out any statement for publication. It is understood from his friends however that he was making the round trip from Halifax on the Plant Line steamer and had no intention of absconding. It is probable that he will be held in custody here till Monday when he will be taken to Halifax by an officer who will arrive to-night. At the time of his arrest Mr. Cattarach desired to be taken to Halifax in the company of an officer but this was not permitted.
