In March 1941 by representatives of those organizations, to co-ordinate their efforts and to act as the provincial unit of the C.F.A.

HOW HAS IT BEEN RUN AND FINANCED SINCE 1941?

Because of limited finances and troubled times your directors, elected annually, worked with sincerity and perseverance on a voluntary basis since that time.

WHAT ARE THE FUTURE PLANS IN THOSE MATTERS?

- 1. To maintain a full time office and Secretary to provide information and assistance to farmers with our organizational, distribution, marketing and many unforeseen problems.
- 2. To present and keep the farmer's case and problems before the consuming public so that each group will better understand and realize the position of the other.
- 3. To protect the interests of both producers and consumers from the influence and pressure of unfair business tactics.
- 4. To support and work with our Canadian Federation in dealing with similar problems of National and International scope.

WHAT CONTROL WILL EACH FARMER-MEMBER HAVE OVER THE FEDERATION?

He will have a voice and vote at all Federation meetings which will be held regularly at different centres in each county. Your annual membership card will show that you are supporting your organization and will give each an opportunity of helping to direct policy and elect directors.

HOW CAN I BECOME A MEMBER AND GET MY 1949 MEMBERSHIP CARD?

If you are a bona fide farmer contact your school secretary and pay him your 1949 membership fee. You will later receive your membership card direct. Don't wait for him to contact you!
