—NEW PASTOR FOR CHRISTIAN CHURCH — Rev. Albert Smith, who graduated from McMaster University in Toronto recently has taken up his residence in Summerside. Rev. Mr. Smith was here last summer supplying in the Christian Baptist Church during Rev. W. H. Harding's holiday and made a host of friends. He was recently appointed to the pastorate of this church and commenced his duties this week. The interior of the Christian Church has been undergoing considerable renovation and remodeling. Handsome new seats are being put in and other improvements made.—S

—DISCHARGED 240 PUNCEONS OF MOLASSES — The S. S. Cornwallis, Capt. R. S. Corkum, which had unloaded one thousand punceons of molasses at Charlottetown, arrived at Summerside at 4 a. m. on Wednesday and after discharging 240 punceons for Summerside merchants left the same evening for Quebec. She is a vessel of about 1800 tons and still has some three thousand punceons on board, which will be unloaded at Quebec and Montreal. She then returns to Halifax and thence to Bermuda, Porto Rica, Antigua and other northern ports, on which route she carries, besides cargo, passengers and mails. This is her regular route, on which there are twenty-six ports of call. Her next trip this way, again calling at Charlottetown and Summerside will be in August.—S

—SUNDAY SCHOOL CONVENTION — The Summerside District Sunday School convention was held in the United Baptist Hall on Wednesday afternoon. Mr. Major W. Townsend of Sherbrook was the chairman. Reports were read from the different Sunday Schools of the district, which were well represented as was also the Summerside schools. Miss Hilda Allen, Girls Work Secretary of the M. R. E. C., was present and held an interesting discussion on Sunday school work. She stressed the importance of training the children for future leadership and recommended a special course of instruction for the children on those lines. These courses could be taken at the different summer schools and camps in the Maritime Provinces, or they could be given in the Sunday school by the teachers themselves. Mrs. George MacPherson, District Secretary read the minutes of the previous convention and gave the financial statement. Miss Allen held a convention at Fyne Valley for that district on Wednesday evening.—S

She leaves to mourn six sons and two daughters namely:—Daniel, of Summerside; Andrew in Boston, Mass.; Howard, in Western Canada; Samuel in Clifton and James and John on the homestead; Mrs. William Marks of Clinton and Mrs. James Graham, of French River; also a number of grandchildren and great-grandchildren and one sister, Mrs. Edward Dowling, formerly of Summerside and now of Boston, Mass., and one brother, Alexander, in the Hawaii Islands, to whom deep sympathy is expressed. The funeral took place from the home of her son, Mr. James Dunning, on Wednesday afternoon to Margate Cemetery, Rev. Mr. Bishop officiating and was one of the largest funerals ever held in the district. The honoured remains were laid to rest in the family plot at Margate. The pallbearers were her four sons, Messrs Daniel, Samuel, James and John Dunning and her two grandchildren Messrs Lorne and Glen Dunning.—S
