Livestock Market

(Canadian Press) MONTREAL, June 10—There were 66 cattle, 1340 calves, 301 hogs and 132 sheep and lambs, for sale on the two Montreal livestock markets today. Yesterday's market closed with three or four loads of good steers selling for \$10.50 and one load for \$10.75. Cattle today were just common cows and were sold from \$3.00 for canners, to \$7.00 for plain butcher cows. Calves, were slow. Packers were not buying. Veal calves of fair to good average quality sold for \$8.35 to \$8.50, with one lot for \$9.00. Common to just fair drinkers sold for \$6.00 to \$7.00. Just medium quality calves, including drinkers and veals, sold for \$7.00 to \$8.00. Sheep were mostly \$8.00 and spring lambs weighing between 45 and 55 pounds brought \$15.00 to \$16.00. Common light lambs were not wanted. Hogs were steady at \$13.25 to \$13.50 for bacon and butchers including light hogs. Heavy hogs were sold between \$11.50 and \$12.50. Sows were around \$10.00.
