Stock Markets At A Glance

CHICAGO, Nov. 8 — (AP) — Grain futures markets, almost the start today, eased back under the pressure of profit taking but later recovered part of their loss. Wheat and rye showed the greatest gains. WINNIPEG, Nov. 8 — (CP) — Oats business was estimated at 1,000,000 bushels today on the Winnipeg Grain Exchange with shippers taking 500,000 to fill old contracts and eastern dealers another 500,000. LONDON, Nov. 8 — (CP Reuter) — A prominent feature in the Stock Markets today was the strength of the Argentine rails which gained around 41 helped by the Argentine Government decree granting temporary remittance concessions to British owned lines.

TORONTO, Nov. 8 — (CP) — The Toronto Stock Market was neither elated nor depressed by the result of Tuesday's national elections in the United States. It registered only narrow changes today, showing small index gains for the mining groups and the Western Oils and a minor index loss for the industrialists at the close. Heavy trading in some of the enemy issues put volume up to 639,000 shares.

NEW YORK, Nov. 8 — (AP) — Financial markets received the election results with notable composure today and only mild irregularity was displayed by stocks and bonds while most commodities turned to the rising side. The Associated Press 60-stock average was unchanged at 55.4. Oil futures registered, 331 were down, 283 up and 308 unchanged. Transfers totalled 732,330 shares compared with 866,230 Monday.

Former Editor Of London Times Dies

LONDON, Nov. 7 — (CP) — Geoffrey Dawson, 70, editor of the London Times for two periods, 1912-19 and 1923-41, died today. As editor of the authoritative British newspaper, Dawson was a prominent figure in the government on matters of high international importance. Mr. Dawson probably was the most influential journalist in Britain. He was educated at Eton and Oxford University and at the end of the last century became an official at the colonial office. From 1901-1905 he was private secretary to Lord Milner in South Africa, and then for five years edited the Johannesburg Star. He was a former secretary and trustee of the Rhodes Trust. His widow, one son and two daughters survive.

New Atlantic Air Crossing Record Set

MONTREAL, Nov. 17 — A new trans-Atlantic record of ten hours and 13 minutes, one hour and one minute less than the old record set last January, was clocked yesterday by a new Lancaster of Trans Canada Airlines flying from Montreal non-stop to Britain. The plane was carrying 6,001 pounds of mail, mostly for troops overseas and 2,036 pounds of priority freight. There were no passengers aboard. The pilot on the flight was Capt. G. B. Lothian of T. C. A. who last January held the record for 11 hours and 15 minutes after taking off from Dorval. Two minutes later another plane, which left Dorval four minutes after him, landed to set the time at 11 hours and 14 minutes.
