At the evening service Mr. Gardner took as his text, St. Paul's Epistle to the Philippians 3:17. St. Paul's system for living a new Christian life may be classified under three headings. 1. Forget the things that are behind. 2. Reach forward. 3. Press onward toward the mark. Only as God becomes the centre does a man begin to unite with God. He must give up the whole of us. The choir under the efficient direction of Mr. Lillian Earle sang very beautifully the two anthems 'Hallelujah, Christ is Risen'—Simper and 'Stainer' have taken away my Lord—Stainer.
