Automobile Traffic

for the

Charlottetown Exhibition

In order to avoid accidents during Exhibition Week the Directors of the Exhibition Association applied to the Government and the Acting Mayor of Charlottetown. Acting on their request the Government have passed an order-in-council which will be published in the Royal Gazette on Saturday next restricting the use of automobiles on portions of certain streets during certain hours on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday of next week between the hours of 11.30 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. These restrictions will be as follows:—

No automobile will be allowed to travel going east on Fitzroy Street between Weymouth Street and the Railway Crossing nor on Kent Street between Cumberland Street and the Railway Crossing nor on the Kensington-Road west of the eastern boundary of the Exhibition grounds. The route for automobiles will be as follows:—

Going east by Grafton Street to the Fork Factory and from there east by a street or road crossing the railway track towards the shooting range, connecting with Park Street landing their passengers at the junction of Park Street and the Kensington Road, the automobiles returning west by Fitzroy or Kent Streets.

The above we think will be appreciated by both auto drivers and carriage drivers and the public generally. All auto and carriage drivers should keep strictly to the rules laid down, and keep strictly to the proper side of the street. If this is done there will be no danger of accidents.

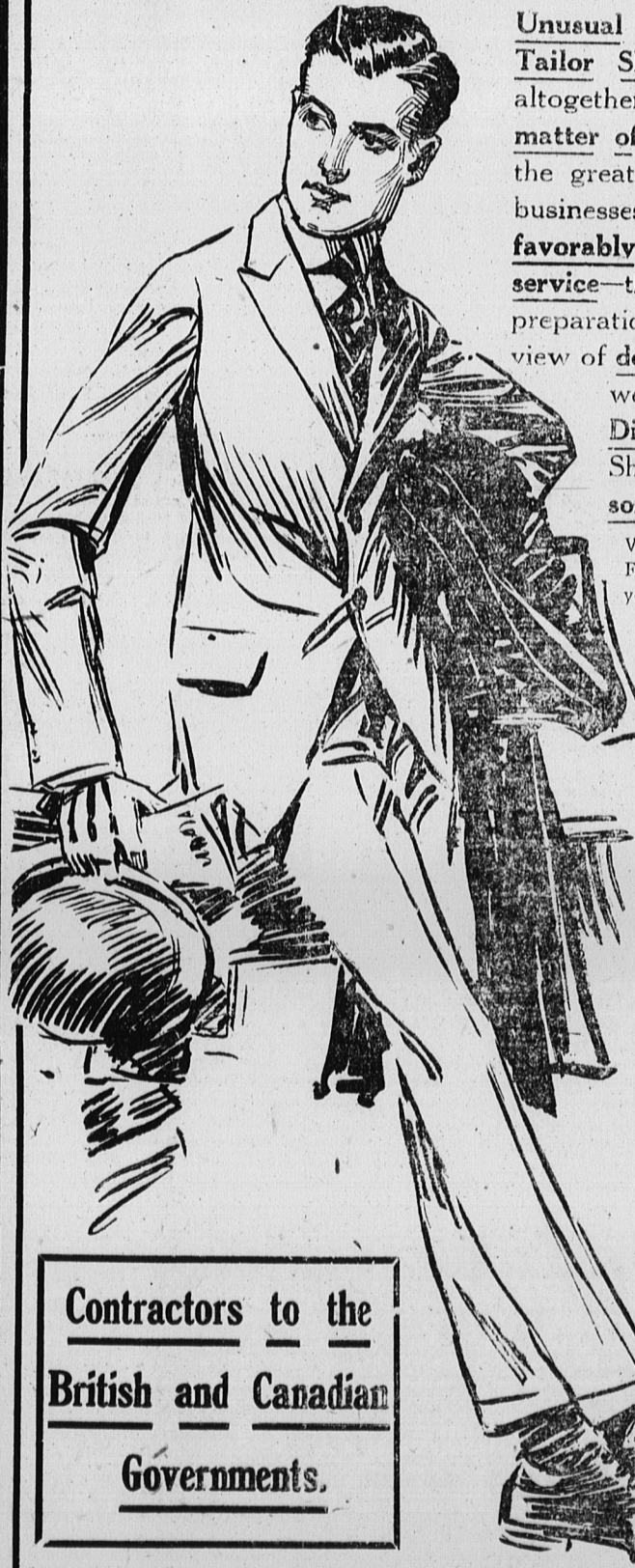
