

# Maple Leafs Win Nat. Hockey League Title

## Stage Uphill Fight To Whip Red Wings 5-3 Saturday Night

TORONTO, March 21—(CP)—For the first time in a decade Toronto Maple Leafs today were champions of the National Hockey League, thanks to an uphill fight Saturday night which carried them to a 5-3 victory over the second-place Detroit Red Wings.

The win also gave Walter (Turk) Broda a two-goal edge in his race to the wire with Detroit's Harry Lumley for hockey's highest award to goaltenders—the Vezina trophy—which was to be decided as the same teams clash in the last scheduled game in Detroit Sunday.

When the two padded men took their positions Saturday night before 14,533 fans they each had 138 goals charged against their team. The pressure of battling for the award and possibly \$4,000 booty in bonuses caused both goalies to succumb to an attack of jitters.

As the clubs battled for the N. H. L. title and the preferred position in the Stanley Cup playoffs, the netminders took turns at fanning on shots. Lumley, younger of the pair, was snaky even on shots he stopped, while Broda settled down after the early minutes of the second period.

Broda Kennedy sparked the Leafs to their third title in N. H. L. history as he fired two goals. The team won the league honors in 1933, 1935, and 1942 but this is the first time they have received the Prince of Wales Trophy. Until 1939 the trophy was awarded to the team topping the American division when the league was operated in two sections.

Loudest roar of the night came when Captain Syd Apples of the Leafs netted his 198th goal in league play, after Wally Stanowski circled the net. Harry Watson and Vic Lynn completed the Toronto total.

## Acadia Axemen Win 14-8 From S.D.U. In Intercollegiate Opener

WOLFVILLE, N. S., March 21—(CP)—Acadia Axemen defeated St. Dunstan's University 14-8 Saturday night to take a stranglehold on the Maritime intercollegiate hockey crown.

Second game of the two-game, total-goal series is scheduled for Charlottetown Wednesday.

The Axemen set a blistering pace as they fired 54 shots at the Charlottetown team's goal. The visitors showed lack of competition after waiting two weeks for the Nova Scotia colleges to declare a champion. St. Dunstan's had gained the finals by defeating the New Brunswick champions.

The powerful Acadia team brought to 53 the number of goals they have scored in the last four games as they outskated and outpassed St. Dunstan's.

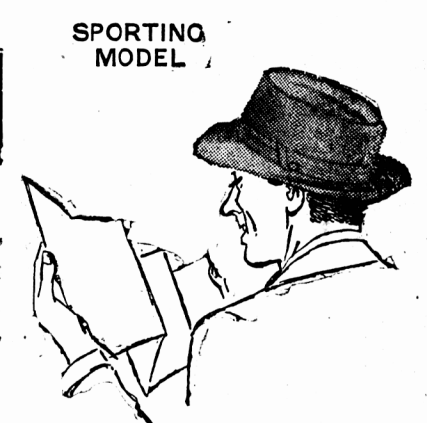
