'THE SEA HAWK' RICH IN DRAMA Sabatini's Novel Made Into Outstanding Picture of Year by Frank Lloyd.

Sudden Death of Purser D. D. Ryan The sudden death of Mr. Dominick D. Ryan, the well known purser of the car ferry steamer 'Prince Edward Island' came as a severe shock yesterday morning. Since the departure of that steamer for Halifax to go on the dry dock, Mr. Ryan has been acting as purser on the 'Scotia.' About nine o'clock yesterday morning just when the ship was ready to sail, from Borden he complained of a pain in the region of the heart. After the passenger cars had been placed on the tery he went into one of the cars to start checking the passengers, and suddenly collapsed. When those who were in the car reached him they found that he had passed away. The body was taken ashore, and Dr. Bell of Cape Tormentine, on his arrival he examined the body and pronounced death was due to heart failure. Mr. Ryan was born at Montserrat seventy years ago. When a youth he came to Georgetown and was apprenticed as Clerk with the late Michael Hession, general merchant, remaining with him seven years. Later he began his career as purser, serving continuously in all forty-six years in winter on the Dominion Government boats plying between the Island and the mainland, and in summer on the boats of the Steam Navigation Company, until the service was taken over by the Railway Department in 1916. He was of four winter steamers 'Northern Light,' 'Stanley,' 'Earl Grey,' and 'Car Ferry Prince Edward Island' and also on four Borden yesterday by A. A. Henships of the Steam Navigation Company. The date of the funeral will be announced later.
