TO EMPLOY APPROXIMATELY 25,000 CHRISTMAS HELPERS Canada's Post Office is prepared to cope with what may well be its busiest Christmas season: Steps have been taken to add approximately 22,000 temporary helpers to Postal staffs, and Postmaster General Ernest Bertrand, K.C. M.P., states that preference for these positions is being given War Veterans and unemployed heads of families.

There will be no mail delivery on Christmas Day as the Post Office intends that, as far as possible, its Letter Carriers and personnel generally, shall spend the holiday at home. The public can again give valuable co-operation by "Mailing Early For Christmas" to enable the Post Office to deliver the millions of letters, greeting cards and Christmas parcels on time. The public is requested to post its Christmas mails before the following dates: Mails to the United States - December 10th. Local Delivery - December 19th. (proportionately earlier for out-of-town points in Canada.) All are asked to be certain that all their mail is correctly addressed and fully prepaid and that all parcels are packed properly, and securely wrapped and tied. The Post Office again requests the public not to use fragile cardboard shoe-boxes, etc., but to pack parcels in strong, shock-proof, corrugated containers wrapped in several folds of thick wrapping paper and tied securely with several rounds of strong twine. Only such items as will not break, spill or become damaged in transit, or damage the surrounding mails should be mailed. Early Christmas Mailing and a careful observance of simple rules will enable all the letters, parcels and greeting cards to be delivered before Christmas Day.
