REMINISCENCES OF A CANADIAN

His Dare Devil Experiences Thrillingly Related

Good Story of Charley Ross, the Canadian Scout Who Has Made a Name in South Africa.

The Liberal Review of Seattle, Wash. gives an interesting reminiscence of Sergeant Charley Ross, the noted Canadian Scout, who has had to leave South Africa for Portuguese Territory, owing to some sharp practice.

The Riel Rebellion was caused by, in the first place, mistaken ideas of the Metis or half-breeds of the Northwest Territories, had as to their rights to squat on lands a second time.

Following this outbreak, a general raising occurred and away up on the Saskatchewan River, cut off by days and days from the railroads, the pretty little town of Battleford was besieged by half-breeds and Indians.

The inhabitants, men, women and children, took refuge in the stockade fort of the mounted police. The fort was defended by a troop of that dandy outfit—the N. W. M. P.

A telegram telling of the siege was received at Ottawa; then night and silence settled down. The wire was cut and no word could come.

A column under Otter, now of Passsberg fame, was sent from Ontario to relieve the place, and started in a snow storm from the Union depot, Toronto, on their long journey of 2,000 miles. The march over the frozen north shore of Lake Superior, the arrival at Winnipeg, and the further trip to Swift Current, may some day be told.

The finish was exciting, as the besieged were suffering from the confinement and were pressed for water. Sickness was breaking out, and while the police would rather have died to a man and every one with them than surrender, the danger of sickness and starvation was very imminent.

Many exciting affairs occurred on the march across country from Swift Current. As the Indians hovered round, the column the entire way, the utmost vigilance was required.

One day in scouting along, Ross' pony slipped, and his rifle barrel, carried cross ways on the horn of the saddle, stuck in the earth just long enough to plug the muzzle with dirt. He was close to a band of hostiles, and was scattered with hundreds of yards separating the men from one another.

Ross received many congratulations on his presence of mind and fortunate escape. The writer, when shaking hands with Charley, remarked that it was a very narrow escape—the scout had two bullet holes through his shirt.
