Stock Markets At A Glance

CHICAGO, Aug. 2 — (AP) —
Coarse grains were under selling
pressure in today's futures trading,
with wheat holding about steady.
At the close wheat was 1/2 lower,
Sep. 1.85 3-8. Corn was 1/4 to 1-8
lower, Dec. 1.18 1/2. Oats were
1-2 lower, Sep. 54 1-2. Rye was
7-8, to 2 1/4 lower, Sep. 1.45 1/2.
Barley was 1/2 to 3/4 lower, Sep. 1-
13 1/4.

WINNIPEG, Aug. 2 — (CP) —
Export business of the Winnipeg
Grain Exchange was in the doldrums
today with only 300,000 bushels sold to an unnamed
European country for relief pur-
poses.
Lack of offerings kept domestic
business at a standstill. The
market closed 1/2 lower.

MONTREAL, Aug. 2 — (CP) —
Junior mines were followed in their
spurt on Tuesday with expanded
activity on the Stock Exchange
and Curb Market and on the
whole gave a rising display. A-
mong major issues trends are
steady, many stocks failing to
change their positions, to mixed.
The Sullivan stocks sparked the
activity in junior issues as a re-
action to a favorable drilling re-
port for East Sullivan. Others get-
ting lifts were Heva, O'Brien, Au-
man, Red Crest, Rochester,
Standard, Joliet, Stadacona, Gold-
ora, Entremac, Central Cadillac,
Siscoe and Beaufort. Pandora was
ahead temporarily and Macdonald
and Cartier Melaric slipped.

TORONTO, Aug. 2 — (CP) —
In the heaviest trading since the
end of June, the gold stocks ad-
vanced today on the Toronto Ex-
change to show an index gain of
41 at the close.
A report that a new find had
been made on the East Sullivan
property started the issue on a
substantial advance and other
listings of the gold group trailed
along. East Sullivan closed at 3.95
for a net gain of 45 cents on trade
of 29,000 shares. Closing prices were
up 10 cents or more for O'Brien,
the Powell, the Siscoe and Au-
livan and gains of 5 to 8 cents were
held by Aubelle, Aumaque, Baga-
mac, Heva Cadillac, Kirkland Lake,
Madden, Malartic gold fields, Sa-
nator, Teck Hughes and Wright-
Hargreaves. McIntyre gained 2
points. Prices were down moder-
ately for Bear, Cochenour, Williams,
Croinor, Duquesne, Giant, Hasaga,
Springer Sturgeon and Trans-Re-
sources.

NEW YORK, Aug. 2 — (AP) —
Stock Market leaders, with scat-
tered exceptions, resumed the
downward drift today without
touching off any real liquidation.
Deals were sluggish from the
start and transfers for the full pro-
ceedings of 600,000 shares were the
smallest for a full session since Ap-
ril 9 and compared with 650,000
Wednesday. Losses running to a
point or so were reduced in most
cases in the final hour.
The Associated Press 60-stock
composite was off 2 of a point at
64.4.
Canadian issues generally showed
strength. Dome mines was
4 1/2, McIntyre 1/2 and Distillers Sea-
grams a point. C.P.R. was off 1/4.
