RAVEL's Humpty Dumpty Company, which appeared in the Charlottetown Opera House some time ago, are booked for Sackville on Thursday evening next.

The first meeting of the Cheese Board will be held on June 14th. Two sessions will be held one at 11 and another at 2 p. m. At the morning session cables will be submitted.

By letter received in the city yesterday by Dr. R. McNeil from Col. McLeod, Montreal, it is learned that he is steadily improving and that he hopes to be home about the middle of June.

BISHOP COURTNEY, Nova Scotia, has already confirmed over 1,000 candidates since the New Year. He will hold confirmation in Charlottetown during the latter part of June.

BOSTON POST, 16th: "Merit is recognized ashore and afloat, and the latest one to be heard from in promotion is William Power of the steamer City of Ghent, who has been promoted to a berth as a second officer on the Plant Line Halifax."

The work of connecting houses with the sewer system is gaining in favor with our citizens. Already 25 connections have been made this year and in one case it was necessary to place 250 feet to the main on Cumberland Street to connect with a house now being constructed. According to law houses cannot be constructed in further without being plumbed.

IN response to enquiries the steamer to replace the Jacques Cartier THE GUARDIAN visited upon Premier Farquharson yesterday afternoon and learned that for some time past the Government were negotiating for a steamer at Boston but the correspondence revealed that the steamer in question was not suited to the service, the greatest objection being to the boiler. Mr. Farquharson states that for the present the Hillsboro will make two trips a day to the different points if desired.

THE Government steamer Minto arrived Saturday from Sabie Island. In his report since the last call at the island, Superintendent Boutillier stated that on April 27th, two fishermen named Bougard Francois and H. J. Baptiste, belonging to the fishing schooner Aristide, of Concale, France, in a dory drifted ashore on the island very much exhausted, after being adrift two days, having lost sight of their vessel. They landed near the West End light. On April 30th, two more French fishermen, Bosset Yric and Nathallaine Laurent, of the schooner L'Anglaisaise, of St. Pierre, drifted ashore in their dory and they were very weak and exhausted. They reported they had been adrift six days and had subsisted on fresh fish and water. The four men are still at the island and were coming along well under Superintendent Boutillier's care when the Minto left. On May 6th a dory of the schooner Aristide, to which the first two arrivals belonged, drifted ashore on the island.—Halifax Chronicle.
