CORNWALL MEETING.—A union meeting of the Cornwall, York Point and Meadow Bank Women's Institutes was held in Cornwall School house Monday, Feb. 2nd. Quite a number were present. When routine business was disposed of the question of having a public meeting of some kind was brought up. This was discussed by the members and it was decided to have a Valentine tea on Monday, Feb. 16th. After making all necessary arrangements for the tea, the meeting closed by singing the National Anthem.

THE MARKET.—There was a fair market in Charlottetown Tuesday. In the interior eggs sold at 36 cents per dozen, butter from 28 to 30 cents per pound, chickens and fowl at from \$1.20 to \$2.00 per pair and turkeys at 14 cents per pound. The butchers offering beef for sale outside the market building received from 7 to 10 cents per pound by the quarter for their meat. Hides were bought at 10 1/2 cents per pound. The first hay brought into the market for some time was offered for sale at from 70 to 75 cents per pound.

THE STEAMERS.—The Minto left Pictou at 7 a. m., Tuesday and docked at Georgetown at 10.30 a. m. Her cargo consisted of 125 sacks of mail 100 tons freight, besides 30 passengers. She left again at 11.30 for Pictou, and will return to Georgetown Wednesday bringing over the freight, mail and passengers. The Earl Grey, which had stopped during the night about seven miles north-east of Amet Island, where she had been ordered to go to investigate the distress signals displayed there, reached Georgetown at 11.15 a. m., with 7 passengers, 50 tons freight and 30 sacks of mail.

AUTOMOBILE SCHOOL.—The first day class in the automobile school completed their lectures and shop practice last week, and the following students have successfully passed their examinations in this department: W. These men will return to receive instructions in driving and to complete the course as soon as the streets are in a condition favourable to motor car driving. The second day class is now well in progress. The night classes are doing splendid work and will complete their shop-work and lecture course by the end of next week, the road work, being taken up later provided conditions permit. The equipment of the school is constantly being added to. The Stromberg Motor Devices Company of Chicago have contributed a cross-section carburettor complete for demonstration purposes. The Remo Magneto Company have given a magneto for the use of the school, and the Bosch Magneto Company, of New York, are supplying a magneto at a specially low rate. A second night class will be opened about the middle of this month. So far over fifty have enrolled.

In two instances the defendants were convicted and fined each \$5, with the option of thirty days' imprisonment. In the third case, the defendant, who had been allowed out on bail, did not surrender his bail, and at the direction of the Magistrate, the amount of his bail, \$10, was estimated.

THE EGG MARKET.—The egg market here has been unusually steady during the past three weeks or so. The quantity of eggs coming in remains about the same, the difference being very slight, but leaning towards a rise in number rather than a decrease. The mild weather has no doubt caused this steadiness in the market, for under its influence poultry are producing more eggs, and this has enabled the farmers to lower the selling price, which now ranges from thirty-two cents wholesale to thirty-four and thirty-six cents retail.

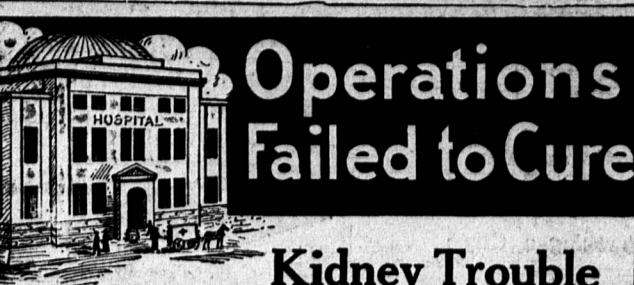
