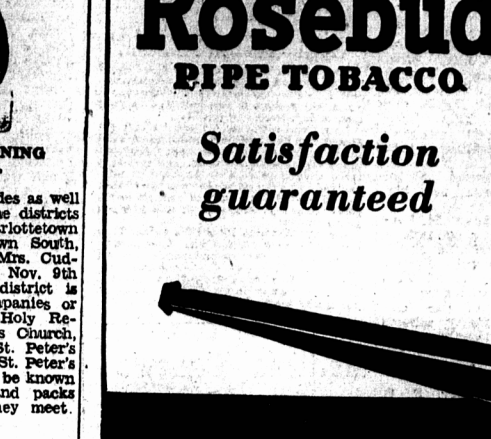
Speaking For Nurses

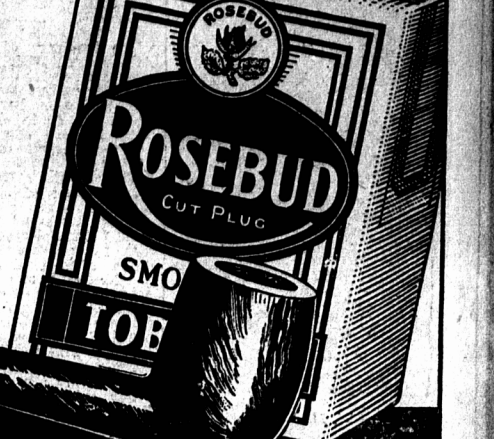
