**THE EXODUS AGAIN.**

That there was in years past a large outflow of population from the Provinces to the States is indisputable, though it would be very difficult to determine its precise extent. In the days when each political party blamed the policy of the other party as the cause of the exodus there was no doubt a plentiful supply of misinformation on the subject. First the National Policy was brought in with the claim that it would stop the outflow of our people, and it was afterwards claimed and denied that it had done so. Then the Liberals undertook to stop the exodus and are now claiming that they have mainly done so. To this the answer is made that last year there were household effects to the value of \$1,165,893 exported, and over a million of this value went to the United States. It is a pretty fair inference that the householder in most cases went with the effects and to the same place.

Very shortly the Canadian census will be taken and we shall then know the essential features of the increase and movements of our population during the ten years past. Estimates and guesses have been from time to time made of the present population of the country, and it will not be surprising if many of these are found to be too high. The exodus goes on, whether under Liberal or Conservative rule, and in the ten years will probably be found to equal the influx of settlers, so that if Canada retains a population equal to what she had in 1891 with the natural increase thereon added it will be as much as can reasonably be expected. In the recent prosperous years we have doubtless done something better than this, while in the earlier years of the decade the balance was probably the other way. In the year 1900 the settlers' effects imported made a total of \$3,063,410 of which \$2,385,724 was from the States. It is highly gratifying to note that twice as much value of this kind crossed from the States to Canada last year as from Canada to the States, whereas in former years the balance had been very largely the other way. It is to be hoped, and with apparently good reason to be believed, that the balance may continue on the right side hereafter.

The change has been mainly brought about by an influx from the United States to Manitoba, the Northwest, and the mining regions of British Columbia. In the meantime there remains a constant exodus from Ontario, Quebec and the Maritime Provinces, an increasing proportion of which goes to the Canadian West while a large share still goes to the States. We incline to the opinion that the census will show the population of Prince Edward Island to be very little greater than it was in 1891 and 1891. Where a population mainly devoted to farming has attained a density of 55 to the square mile any considerable increase cannot be expected. We have very few factories except those of the dairy, no lumbering or mining industries, and until we develop manufacturing to some considerable extent the natural increase of our population will go abroad. The migratory instinct is very strong in the Anglo-Saxon race, the facilities for travel increase from year to year and the larger field of the great West and the United States will continue to attract a portion of our young people from year to year.

It is announced that Lord and Lady Minto will pay a visit to the Maritime Provinces during the coming summer. The exact date of the visit has not yet been fixed.
