MONTREAL, Feb. 19.—(CP)—There were 11 cattle, 11 sheep and lambs, 677 hogs, and 78 calves for sale on Montreal livestock markets today.

All classes of livestock were unchanged. There were not enough cattle and lambs offered to make a market.

Veal calves ranged from \$9 to \$12 with one choice up to \$13. Medium quality veals \$10.50 to \$11. Drinkers were \$6 to \$8.50 and grassers \$5.

Hogs were unchanged at \$11.50 for B-1 dressed, \$8.50 for B-1 alive fed and watered and \$8.75 off trucks delivered. Grade "A" drew \$1 per premium with discount on off grades. Sows were \$5.50 to \$6.50.

Further Evidence Given In Alleged Rum-running Case

Further evidence in the case against George Albert Griffin, Sturgeon, and Harry F. Walsh, St. Piers, charged with breach of the Customs, Excise and Sales Tax regulations governing entry of liquor into Canada, was given by three Crown witnesses before Magistrate George J. Tweedy, K. C., yesterday afternoon. C. St. Clair Trainor, K. C., appeared for the Crown and St. Hessian, K. C., for the defendants. The case was further adjourned until 10 o'clock this morning.

John Steele, farmer, Newport, P. E. I., gave evidence of having met the defendant Griffin in Charlottetown on Monday, July 29, 1940. Griffin asked him to go on a fishing trip with him to St. Pierre where he was going to buy a schooner. Witness finally agreed to go for \$50. They arranged to leave next day, when Griffin called for witness at his own shore north of Cardigan River, in Griffin's motor car and both went to the shore. Reginald Montaigne and "a chap by the name of Campbell" who is a real name, witness learned later, were with Griffin. They left on Tuesday and landed first at Cape St. Lawrence, then at St. Pierre where they remained until Saturday. They took a plot with them to "couldn't sell it now; he was going to use it." Griffin said he could wait. One man in the vessel said they had "some stuff to unload" and that they could not land the dory. Senchaugh, he said, was "asleep part of the time" and was in the habit of doing this quite frequently.

Witness described the loading on board, from dories, of between fifty and sixty wooden cases containing liquor, some in metal cans, and some in wooden kegs of four or five gallons each. He helped to handle the kegs out where he did not know what they were. He said that he saw the two terminals there was a sign of open water anywhere.
