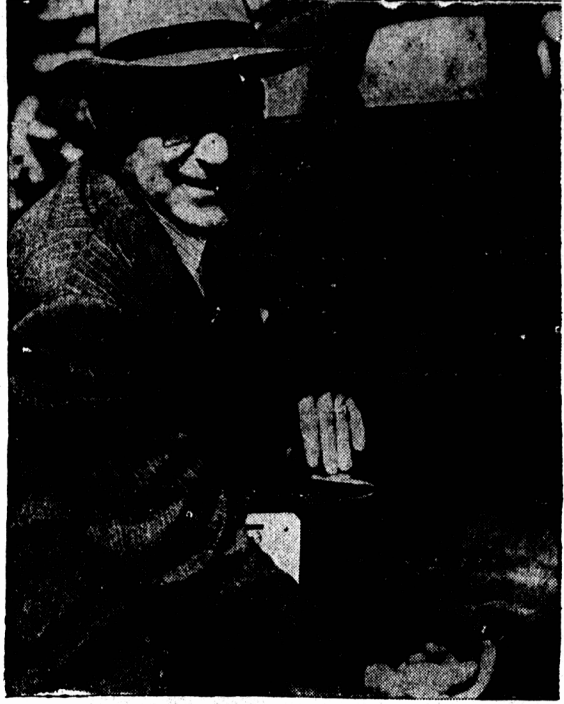


NEWS of the WORLD in PICTURES

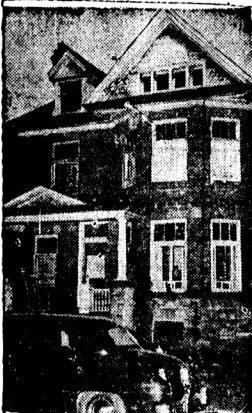

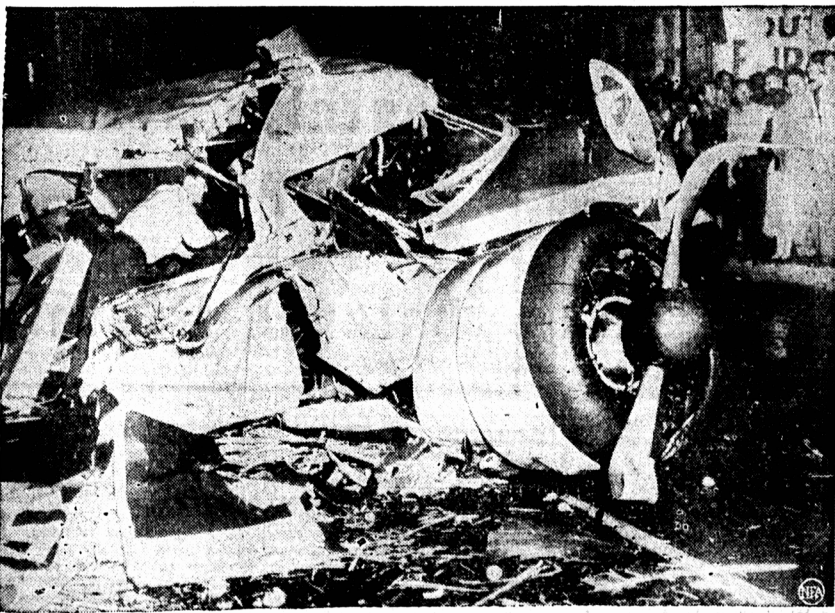
