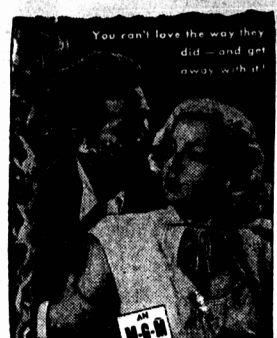

Plans 12th General Council United Church

TORONTO, Aug. 25 - The general conference of the United Church of Canada, Toronto, released recently the 527 page agenda of the 12th general conference of the United Church of Canada, which is to be opened by the moderator, the Rt. Rev. Jesse H. Arnup, Toronto, at the American Hotel, Toronto, on September 11, with a Communion service in the afternoon. The moderator will be elected and installed that night.

Major items to be dealt with include: Policy of the church towards its colleges and particularly secondary schools; appointments of a full time secretary for the colleges and secondary schools; ordination of women, with special reference to the Margaret Butler case of Montreal; the election of a moderator who is not a commissioner, and the status of deaconesses.

A debate on the report of the commission on Christian marriage and the Christian church, presented by its chairman, Chief Justice McRuer, Reunion with the Anglicans; a basis for union of the Presbyterian Church of Ontario with the United Church of Canada; the crusade for Christ.

Consideration of long range policies for all the major boards for the reconstruction period will be undertaken, with the possibility of a reconstruction and rehabilitation fund being launched, recommended.
