FESTIVAL OF THE FIRST PRIEST OF THE JESUITS.

Members of the Society of Jesus will observe today the feast of Blessed Peter Favre, the son of poor Savoyard shepherds who became the first priest of the great Catholic order founded by St. Ignatius of Loyola.

Peter Favre, or Faber, was born in Savoy in 1506, and although his parents were very poor, they sent him to school, and afterward to the University of Paris.

After the feast of the Holy Spirit, which Ignatius had already visited as a pilgrim. In August, 1534, Ignatius, Peter, and the five other disciples, took their vows at the chapel of Our Lady of Montmartre, in Paris, adding to the usual obligations of poverty and chastity two others, of obedience to the Pope and visiting the Holy Land. Peter lived for a time apart from his master, but followed rules marked out by Ignatius, living by alms and sleeping on a bare board.
