

Hints for the Motorists

The Scored Cylinder

A Cylinder Bore Is Mirrorlike In Smoothness And A Few Scratches Spoil It

A PERFECT CYLINDER bore and its piston, when continuously lubricated, both tend to wear very smooth in service and, for a time at least, they fit better and better, so that compression improves and the undue escape of oil between them is prevented, but if conditions arise, which prevent the maintenance of a film of suitable oil between the surfaces of piston and cylinder wall, so that the metal of one part rubs directly upon the metal of the other, smooth sliding action ceases and portions of the two parts "dig into" one another, roughening, scratching and grooving their surfaces. Often the grooves are deep, and enter that of the oil of one part, so that the piston cannot be moved in its bore and the engine stops, stuck fast. Both piston and cylinder bore, if badly scored, become unrepairable. There cannot be made to fit tightly and gases and oil escape excessively between them. A scored cylinder cannot be made to hold compression and therefore is weak and wasteful of fuel. Pistons coated with oil to replace, but cylinders are expensive and the scoring of one cylinder of a block of four or six demands the replacing of the whole block—a very costly matter—unless possibly the score can be repaired or unless, as an alternative the cylinders are all bored out and oversize pistons are provided for them. Cylinder scoring is therefore one of the most serious accidents that can befall an engine and is to be guarded against only by the avoidance of lubrication failures and of a few other untoward happenings among which are the following:—The too tight fitting of new pistons, which when expanded by the heat of running, squeeze out the oil and scratch the cylinder bore; the too fast or hard running of a new engine, the pistons and cylinders of which have not become smooth in service; the slipping of a piston so that out of its ends projects out of the piston and rubs against the cylinder wall sufficiently to cut a groove in it; a thing likely to occur if its locking device is not very securely fastened—and allowing abrasive material to remain in the cylinders to grind against valves.

Baseball At Springhill

SPRINGHILL, April 9.—The prospects for baseball in Springhill this season are particularly good. For the past two years the town has had a six team local league for the development of the younger players, which means that today there are more than fifty players who have had experience in regular games, and who can be depended upon not to be rattled by a crowd. This gives an exceptional amount of material to pick the town team from which fact should show itself in the scores at the end of the season.

It is planned this year to begin the rebuilding of the diamond in the Driving Park so that it may be made more pleasant for visiting teams. At present, as all outside teams who have played in Springhill know, the ground slopes rapidly in all directions and is unexpected and disconcerting angles to the delight of those whose business it is to score errors. There will be no more troubles of that sort, for plans are under way for the leveling and rolling of the whole infield and improvement of the surface until it can rank for speed and accuracy with any diamond in the province. The matter is in the hands of a committee consisting of Pres. Martin of the S. A. A. A. and Arthur Bonnyman, a veteran of many baseball battles, who both can be depended upon to get results.

It is hoped that Springhill will have the services of Charlie Paul in the box. The big whiter turned down an offer from the Rochester International League team on the chance of being reinstated as an amateur and being able to pitch his own home town to many victories this year. C. R. Murray, representing Springhill at the Truro conference last night, made a strong appeal for him on the ground that he is the only semipro in the province of Nova Scotia who has not been to the fold by the M. P. A. A., and that it is hardly fair to be content with the white washed ninety and nine while there is still one sheep wandering in the wilderness of professionalism. While no decision on the case has been handed down as yet, Springhill is hoping heartily that President Covey will see the point.

It is intended to reorganize the local league next week for the coming season, and it is rumored that the wealth of the material will make an eight, rather than a six team series a necessity.
