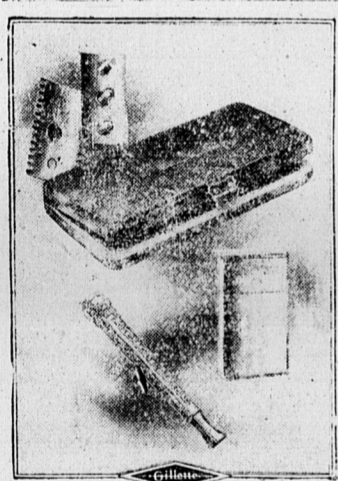

SHIPBUILDING IN HALIFAX.

HALIFAX, Nov. 30.—Halifax is taking prompt steps to tender for a shipbuilding yard for the construction of not merely Canada's naval vessels, but also her merchant ships. The Shipbuilding Investment Co., which was organized years ago and owns a splendid site on the Dartmouth side has been in communication with the famous Tyne firm of Swan, Hunter, Wigham and Richardson, and following the announcement from Ottawa that the Government proposed to aid in establishing yards in Canada, a cable has been received from Mr. Hunter that he was despatching one of the firm's experts to confer with the Halifax Associates. Mr. Clark will arrive on Friday and at once take up the formulation of a practical scheme for a shipyard on the border of Halifax Harbor.
