MEMORIAL SERVICE HELD AT WHEATLEY RIVER HALL. Dedication of Famous War Picture Given By Capt. D. A. MacDonald to Wheatley River School-Presentation in Commemoration of Boys Who Fought In Great War

The residents of Wheatley River district and adjacent parts, and many visitors from the city filled the Wheatley River school house to its capacity last Tuesday evening on the occasion of the unveiling of a picture of the famous war picture "Canadians at Ypres."

This picture which has been presented to the school by Capt. Daniel A. Macdonald, is in memory of those of his former schoolmates who fought and fell in the Great War. Showing, as it does, the courageous actions at the second battle of Ypres by Canadian forces, in the face of the deadly clouds of poison gas used in this battle for the first time, the picture finely depicts the unconquerable spirit which upheld the Canadian soldier throughout the Great War.
