## MONARCHISTS NOT IN LISBON REVOLT

Movement Organized By Extremists to Overthrow Administration.

LISBON, May 6 (Special).—A further investigation of the recent revolutionary movement here seems to have established that it was organized by the socialists and extreme Jacobean republicans, for the purpose of overthrowing the present administration in favor of a more radical change. There is little evidence that the monarchists participated in the movement.

It now appears that many of those who were arrested in the streets had come out of their homes to aid in suppressing what they supposed to be a monarchist rising.  
Ten marines of the cruiser Sao Gabriel were arrested while trying to liberate the prisoners who had been taken aboard the cruiser Republic, and a hundred others on shore and in barracks for attempting to start a military revolt. The government has abandoned the idea of sending the prisoners for trial to the colonies on board the Sao Gabriel, as the attitude of the crew has aroused distrust.

## TELEGRAPH SYSTEM IN PARLIAMENT

Project to Fill Gap in All Red Cable Service by Wireless Stations at Different Points.

(Special to The Guardian) OTTAWA, May 5.—A bill "to provide for more advantageous conditions for telegraphic communication between Canada and the United Kingdom and other parts of the British Empire" was introduced in the House this afternoon by Hon. L. P. Pelletier and occasioned some debate.  
It is intended to ratify a contract to fill a gap in the present all Red cable service and at the same time create an ocean telegraph board, to be composed of the Post Master General, Minister of Marine and Minister of Railways and to make regulations governing the system.

At present the government of Great Britain, Canada, Australia and New Zealand control a trans-Pacific cable and the board of management of that line has leased a telegraph line from Vancouver to Montreal from the Canadian Pacific Railway Telegraph Co.  
By the contract which the Post Master General explained to the House to-day, a wireless service will be secured to complete the communication between the Antipodes and Britain.

Mr. Pelletier said that negotiations had taken place with the Commercial Cable Co. and the Western Union system for a service to fill the gap in the All Red Line between Montreal and England. They had, however, been unsuccessful. It would cost \$5,000,000 to lay a state-owned cable.  
Moreover, Mr. Samuel, the British Post Master General had favored the establishment of a wireless system which would cost only \$300,000 or \$400,000. Accordingly a contract had been made with the Universal Radio Telegraph Syndicate.

## AN IMPERIAL WIRELESS CHAIN

Committee of British Experts Reports in Favor of Marconi System.

LONDON, May 6 (Special).—The committee of experts appointed to investigate existing systems of long distance wireless telegraphy and their capacity for continuous communication over distances required by the imperial chain has issued its report.  
Their main conclusions are that the Marconi system is at present the only one capable of fulfilling the requirements of the imperial chain; it might be better for the government itself to undertake the construction and equipment of the necessary stations; that it is undesirable that the Post Office should be pledged to the continued use of any apparatus now used, and that the Post Office should reserve complete liberty of action.
