Gold Shares Lead Market Rally In N.Y.

BY FREDERICK GARDNER Associated Press Financial Writer NEW YORK, May 4.—(AP)—Sharp bidding for gold shares imparted today and helped turn a forenoon retreat into a rally. Copper and other industrial shares following the golds, turned up in rather brisk late trading on what observers took to be a mild return of inflationary psychology, influenced by the French monetary fever. Transactions totalled 550,600 shares against 472,470 yesterday. The Associated Press composite price of 60 stocks advanced .4 of a point to 39.00 top of yesterday's gain of nearly a point. An advance of three points to 40-1-2 in McIntyre featured a sluggish Canadian list. Domestic gains ranged from 1/2 to 5/8 and Latin American from 1/2 to 1-1/2. International Nickel and Hollinger steadied fractions. Walkers and Imperial Oil were easy. Aircrafts returned to the speculative spotlight after golds' previous chryses also came to life near the finish.

Young Drivers Lead In Auto Accidents

By Guardian's Special Wire) TORONTO, May 4.—Drivers less than 18 years old were involved in more than 18,000 accidents and in more fatalities, proportionately, than those of any other age group in Ontario last year, provincial highway department officials announced today. The second worst record is against drivers of from 18 to 24 years. Drivers over 65 years of age had fewer accidents than any other group and in fatal accident records they are near the top of the six age groups.

Good export demand for barley and domestic purchases in oats did not carry through and the close was under the best prices for the day. Gold stocks registered the sharp response to the exchange readjustment and at the close the Toronto index for the group was up 2.55, its widest gain in months. Lake Shore added 1-2 and Buffalo-Ankerite 3/4. Trade in Lake Shore majority of the medium-price issues held part of their gains. Closing figures were up 10 to 90 cents for Canadian Malartic, Little Long Lac, Macassa and Wright-Harveas and Bralorne added 25 cents.
