CRUELTY TO A HORSE: PUT AS COLT IN CELLAR.

ST CATHARINES, Nov. 1.—A horse placed in a cellar five years ago as a colt and allowed to live there as a prisoner without once having been removed is the subject of the most remarkable case of cruelty to animals in the history of Niagara district. The discovery was made by High Constable Boyle of Lincoln County on a farm in Pelham township, who had brought the matter to the attention of the Humane Society. Boyle, who is agent for the Children's Aid Society in Niagara district, was in the locality Saturday on a mission for the latter organization when this matter came to his attention. The cellar is beneath an old barn. The horse long ago reached a size which rendered it impossible to remove it from the little space in which it was placed as a colt.

When the Lincoln constable left the place the animal was still in its confinement, and must remain there until the building is torn down.
