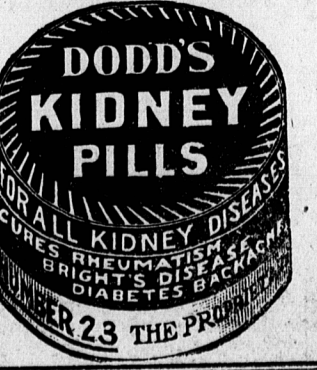

TRAINING EAGLES FOR WAR.

Some officers at Nice, according to a French newspaper, have been training six eagles to attack aeroplanes and dirigible balloons. Although many attempts have been made to construct a gun for destroying aeroplanes, the problem has not yet been solved. These officers therefore chose eagles as capable of attaining the necessary speed and height in the air and began by habituating them to the noise of motors and firearms. Then, by fastening choice morsels of food on small balloons and framework representing an aeroplane, they have trained the birds to throw themselves fiercely on such objects and tear them as they tear prey. Given the power of the eagle's beak and claws it seems likely that an eagle could be counted on to wreck an aeroplane or tear open a dirigible, but as the Gaulois points out, a practical test would be difficult to apply.

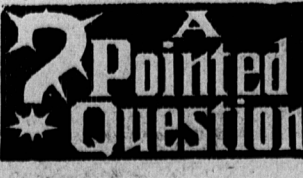
THE COMFORTS OF LIFE.

EGG RECORDS.

Two hens at the experiment station of the Oregon Agricultural College now hold the United States championship for the highest number of eggs laid a year. Each produced 260 eggs, trying for championship. No other experiment station in the country has been able to raise a hen with a record equal to this. Heretofore the best that could be done was the record of 251 eggs laid by a bird in flock of the Maine Experiment Station some years ago. An unofficial record from a private breeder shows 256 eggs some years since, but even this is beaten by the Oregon hens.

One of the birds is a Plymouth Rock, and the other a cross between a Plymouth Rock and a Leghorn. The Plymouth Rock laid 27 eggs in the month of October. This is a matter of breeding, feeding and care. In the same den with the record, Plymouth Rock hen was one which laid but five eggs, although she was of the same breed, and received the same care and feed. The trouble was in her heredity. She was a poor individual.
