est assistance to the ministry. This office he resigned for a time but resumed work in 1859. In this capacity he was mainly instrumental in repealing the paper duty, and in promoting the negotiations which resulted in the commercial treaty between Britain and France.

After the death of Lord Palmerston, he became Leader of the House of Commons and in 1866 resigned with his colleagues. In the election of 1868 he was defeated in Lancashire but was elected to represent another constituency. In 1873 he resigned and Mr Disraeli was sent for to take office which he declined to do. Mr Gladstone then reluctantly undertook to reconstruct the cabinet.

In 1874 the first election took place to be conducted by ballot the bill of enactment in this respect having been passed in the preceding year.

Mr Gladstone resigned in 1874, after election, and Mr Disraeli became Prime Minister. In 1875 he retired and did not reappear in public life until 1880 at which time he formed a new ministry. He resigned again in 1885 and again appeared at the head of the government in 1886. In August of that year Lord Salisbury became Premier which he held until 1892 when Gladstone, for the first time, accepted the reins of power.

In 1892 he succeeded in passing the Irish Home Rule Bill through the Commons. This was rejected by the Lords. Had he been twenty years younger he might have then fought against the Lords the great battle which Premier Asquith is now directing, and today the Home Rule Bill is again before the electors with great prospects for success.

Gladstone resigned finally in 1894, after about fifty years of earnest and faithful service in the public interests.

He died in May 19th, 1898, at the age of eighty nine years, and in his death Great Britain lost the most eminent of her statesmen.

The life of William Ewart Gladstone is so integral a part of his country's history from the time that he entered parliament in 1825 until his last public appearance in his eighty-eighth year, that its best expression is in the Victorian Era.

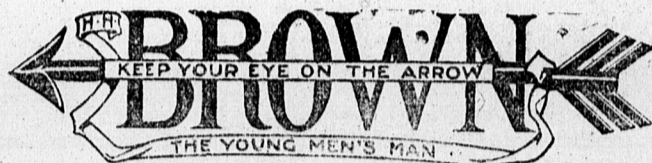

"RED" ADAMS IN JAIL

NEW YORK, December 27—Charles Adams, alias "Red," and other names, charged with being the leader of a clique of swindlers who have cleaned up \$250,000 in the past few years, posed as penniless when arraigned before a United States commissioner here today, but reversed himself and offered \$12,500 cash bail today in order to escape spending Christmas in the Tombs.

The federal authorities refused this amount, with the statement that Adam had forfeited \$30,000 bail after his arrest for a gold-trick deal in Texas in 1900. Accordingly, he will spend the Yuletide season in prison.

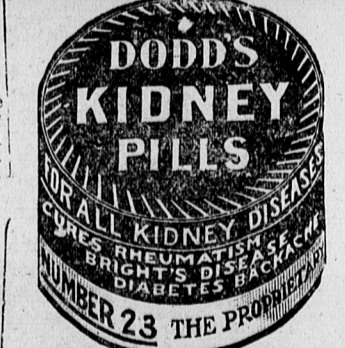
MRS. HARRIMAN IS WORTH 22 MILLIONS

NEW YORK, Dec 27—Although a recent appraisal of the estate of the late Edward H. Harriman placed its value at \$149,000,000, it was reported today in Wall street, on reliable authority, that shortly before his death, Harriman transferred to his wife and eldest son securities worth more than \$50,000,000. These securities have appreciated in value since Harriman's death.

THIRTY-FIVE MILE RIDE FOR FIVE CENT FARE

CHICAGO, Dec 27—A 35 mile ride for five cents will be made possible by the \$70,000,000 merger of all the surface railway lines of the South-side. According to figures given out by President Thomas E. Mitten, of the Chicago City Railways Company, the average total number of passengers carried annually on the lines involved in the railway merger is estimated 220,000,000 are car fares, and the remainder transfers. The various roads involved in the merger cover 497 miles of railway.

STRIKE OF TRAINMEN IN FAR FUTURE

MONTREAL, Dec 27—Although there has been considerable discussion of their wages and hours among local trainmen, and considerable discontent has been expected by a number of the brakemen, there seems to be little likelihood of them going out on strike in sympathy with the striking railway employes of the United States roads. The schedule under which the local trainmen are working does not expire for a year, but they are already drawing up a new rate of wages, and it is said that as soon as the present agreement expires a big movement will be started on the Canadian roads for higher pay and shorter hours. The local unions, it was stated by a prominent official this morning, have been preparing for this for some time, and by the time it is possible for them to take action will have a very solid organization to back up their demands.
