In accordance with the wish of the Premier, that memorial services should be held in all the churches on the Island, the Rev. Mr. Thomas conducted such a service in North Wiltshire church on Sunday evening last. Owing to the bad state of the roads, and the long distance that the pastor had to come, many people did not expect him, consequently the congregation was not very large. But those who did brave the rain and the sloppy roads had the privilege of listening to a very eloquent and forceful discourse on the recent great breavement of the British Empire. The Rev. gentleman based his remarks on II Chron. 32, 32x33 and in most heart-touching language described to his audience the truly Christian manner in which Queen Victoria had always performed her duties as Mother, Wife, and Queen. He touched upon her wonderful influence for good in the world, her zeal for peace, displayed even upon her death-bed and closed his remarks by paying a tribute to our new Sovereign, King Edward VII.

The following is a corrected statement, of the Winsloe Cheese and Butter station for the season 1899-1900 which has just been issued. The factory manufactured butter from December to May and cheese from May 14th to November 3rd. During winter the patrons furnished 150,580 lbs milk and during summer 1,202,230 lbs. The amount of butter manufactured was 6980 lbs; and it realized an average price of 20.5 cents per lb. The amount of cheese manufactured was 112,702 lbs; and average price was 10.085 cents per lb. The average price paid for milk during the summer season was 7 cents per 100 lbs. 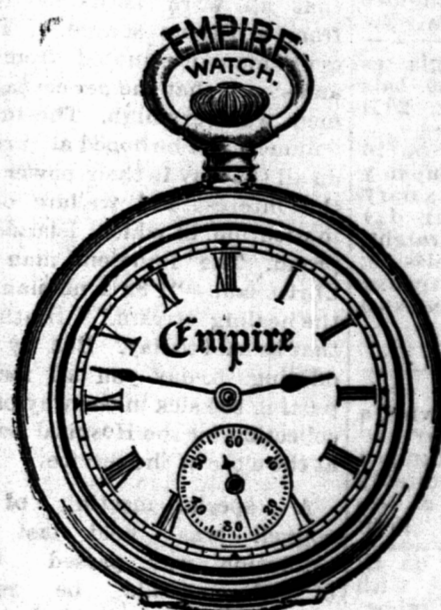

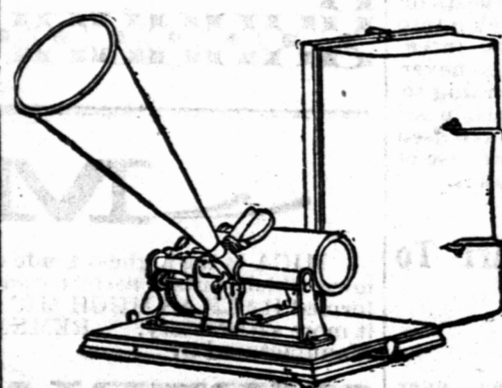
