REAL PROBLEM IS TO PRESERVE UNITY

MONTREAL, Dec 27—Richard B. Bennett, of Calgary, discussed tonight what he flippantly termed "the war scare." He said: "Westerners whom I have talked with do not favor the idea of a Canadian navy at present. There is a very large proportion of Americans in the Canadian west, and many of the leaders among them hold the view that the talk of a Canadian navy at the present time is idle."

The real problem of the future will be, said Mr. Bennett, "how to keep eastern and western Canada together. At present they are bound by three things, sentiment, which is rapidly weakening; railway steel, and the tariff. Easterners have a mission to perform in preaching loyalty to the empire, and to Canada as a whole."

MONCTON, Dec 27—A head-on collision occurred on the I.C.R. yesterday morning at St. Anne, Quebec, west of River du Loup, when the Maritime Express, west bound, collided with a mail special.

UNITED STATES NEWS IN BRIEF

STARVING IN HOUSE HE OWNED. WORCHESTER, Dec 27—Edgar A. Hayward, 56, living at 56 Lyman street, with a \$1400 house as the sum total of his possessions, was found in his home delirious and nearly dead from starvation.

CARDINAL SATOLLI WORSE.

ROME, Dec 27—The condition of Cardinal Satolli became suddenly worse through the complication of blood poisoning with the nephritis from which he has suffered. Receiving cablegrams from Cardinal Gibbons and Archbishop Farley, the prelate commented: "My American friends give me my 1st consolation."

FATALLY HURT IN RUNAWAY.

NEW YORK, Dec 27—Tracy Gorman, a well-known horseman, and a porter familiarly known as "Joe," were fatally hurt in a runaway in Harlem recently. Gorman was driving a pair of thoroughbreds, which ran away, throwing him to the street. The porter, who tried to stop them, was knocked down.

SAFE ROBBED OF \$500.

BALLSTON, N. Y., Dec 27—The safe of the Ballston postoffice was blown open with nitro-glycerine recently and robbed of \$1500. Four men were seen running from the scene of the robbery.

BAR ATTACKS HEINZE LAWYER.

NEW YORK, Dec 27—The Bar Association of New York fled charges with the appellate division of the supreme court today against Sanford Robinson, chief counsel for F. Augustus Heinze, alleging that he is guilty of "deceit, malpractice and gross unprofessional conduct." Robinson was fined \$250 last summer for alleged connection with spiriting away the books of the United Copper Company.

BARON UCHIDA RECEIVED.

WASHINGTON, Dec 27—Baron Uchida, the new Japanese ambassador, was formally received by President Taft in the blue room of the White House and presented his credentials. The usual exchange of felicitous expressions of good will followed.

GASPE TO HAVE WINTER PORT

GASPE, Que., Dec 27—The S. S. Ryhope sailed recently from the inner wharves with a load of lumber for England. The captain is much pleased with the place as a winter port, and says there is no trouble to cater until the end of January with ordinary boats. When the railroad is completed next year there will be something to induce the people to keep the harbor open. It is the impression that the Atlantic, Quebec and Western railroad will do a good winter business.

A TROLLEY CAR PLUNGED INTO RIVER

SEYMOUR, Conn., Dec 27—A trolley car jumped a switch on the route alongside the Naugatuck River, a mile above this place, during today's storm and plunging down the bank, crashed through the ice.

Motorman Fred Beard, and Conductor Marcus Donovan, who were in the enclosed forward vestibule, were drowned. The five passengers crawled from the rear door which protruded above water and escaped with only slight injuries.
