\$150,000 FIRE IN BROOKLINE

Big Plant of Holtzer-Cabot Electrical Company in Heart of Town Practically Destroyed

BROOKLINE, Me. Oct. 9.—Brookline firemen had a hard time last night in extinguishing a fire in the big electrical works of Holtzer-Cabot Corporation, located on Station street, in that town.

The first alarm was sounded at 11.30, quickly followed by a second and a third, calling Boston companies in Jamaica Plain and Roxbury to their aid.

SPREAD IS FEARED.

The location of the factory in the centre of a residential section, the dangerous chemicals stored in the factory building, the possible spreading of the conflagration to a big storage building adjoining the factory, and the glare in the sky made by the fire thoroughly alarmed the town.

People residing in the neighborhood made preparations for moving, until assured by Chief Johnson and his assistant Chief Allen that the fire would be confined to the five-story factory building.

This building will be a total loss. The damage is estimated around \$150,000. There was valuable machinery and a large amount of electric material in process of manufacture destroyed. The loss on machinery

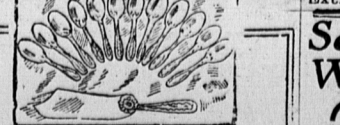

and material is estimated at \$100,000 and the building at \$50,000.

The fire was a difficult and dangerous one to contend with. It was difficult because it was hard to get at, being largely in the centre of the big structure and dangerous because of the chemicals used in the manufacturing process.

It was spectacular, lighting up the lowering clouds with a flaming glare seen for miles around. It was long after midnight before the chief felt assured that he had it under control and confined it to the five-story factory building.

The firemen were forced to do all their work from vantage points on the outside of the structure. It was this caution that saved life, for after the blaze had been destroying the big plant for an hour, an explosion shook the entire structure, bulging out the walls and scattering fire brands far and near.

No harm resulted to the hoemen. This explosion occurred at 12.45 and from that time on the tons of water poured into the building, began to have some effect.

The fire started in a manner unknown on the third floor of the building, a five-story brick structure, extending from 89 to 31 Station street. The fire department first was made aware of it about 11.30 o'clock by a telephone message, and the two night watchmen employed by the company were unaware that the building was afire until the apparatus had arrived.

Once on the scene Chief Johnson ordered a second alarm, and when the dwelling houses directly in the rear of the factory were threatened a third alarm was sounded, bringing assistance from Roxbury and Jamaica Plain.

The firemen, who at first swarmed in the building with lines, were ordered out, by the chief, because of the danger within from the electrical appliances.

The residents in the neighborhood were warned by the police to be in readiness to seek a place of safety when a hour's fight failed to bring the blaze under control.

were dragged into the streets.

The Brookline Storage warehouse, next door to the burning building, was saved and from its roof the fire fighters were able to confine the blaze in the factory.

The Holtzer-Cabot factory was supplied with sprinklers, which refused to work, and the building, with its entire stock and machinery, was destroyed.

It was 2 o'clock this morning before Assistant Chief John Allen, who was in charge of the fire-fighting in Anden place, was able to assure the residents of the dwellings there that the danger was past.

The Holtzer-Cabot Electrical Manufacturing Company, of which Charles Holtzer is president, employed several men and women and manufactured all sorts of electrical goods. Great dynamos, coils of copper wire, elevator motors and electrical goods of every description, some of the material very costly, were among the goods destroyed.

The dwellings on Anden place and the storage warehouse suffered little other than water damage. The railroad station of the Boston & Albany road, just opposite from the rear of the factory, was at first believed to be doomed, but was kept thoroughly wet by the firemen and protected in the same manner as were the dwellings in Anden place.

COLUMBUS GROUP AT THE EDEN MUSEE.

As an attraction for Columbus Day, the Eden Musee of New York City has just placed on exhibition a new group, representing the landing of Columbus and his followers at San Salvadore, on October 12th, 1492.

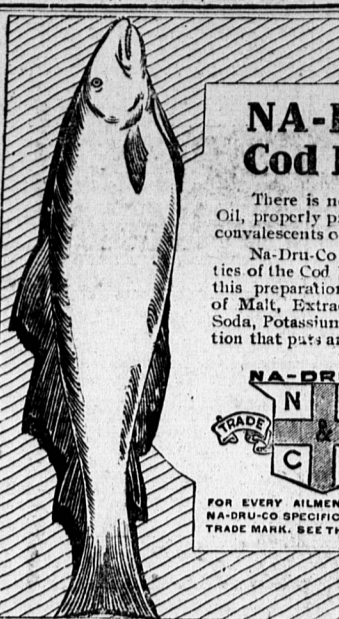

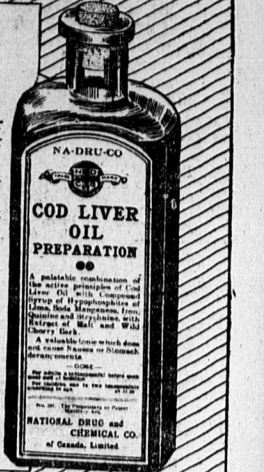
