BOYS OF BRIGADE

Rev. John M. Withycombe of Cleveland

ADDRESSES THE BOYS

An Article that Will be Read With Interest By All.

TO THE BOYS OF THE BRIGADE IN P. E. ISLAND.

Your Committee appointed to prepare a printed statement of the progress of the Brigade's work in the past and its prospective work for the future have done me the honor of soliciting a word, a kind of valedictory, from me as your retiring Major.

First let me say again, what I said before to your officers, how proud I shall always be to remember the honor it was to have held even for one year, the position of Major in the unique Brigade of P. E. Island. I consider your organization unique in that as far as I have been able honestly to judge, no organization of a like kind in Canada has been able to boast of more complete military discipline and government. I am not one who believes in doing things by halves. If we are not afraid of the influence of military training upon boys in a small degree, we should not be afraid of making that feature complete in every particular. I always set before our boys in Summerside that the drill and military discipline was in all respects genuine; that it was not a mere playing at soldiers to deceive the imagination of the boys. It was an application of that which appeals to all that is manly in your instincts as boys, eliminating only that which is deadly and abhorrent in the military art. The only things that we denied you were those that were dangerous to human life. We tried to substitute things which rather tended towards a regard for the sacredness of human life; first in yourselves, that you should cherish and nurture the faculties physical, intellectual and spiritual with which God has endowed each one of you. That you should preserve your bodies as temples of the Holy Spirit, keeping them pure from habits in their essence destructive of your manhood, in every sense in which that word may be understood. Secondly, in your dealings with your comrades, that you should learn to respect and conserve those principles in those with whom you associate. These things your former Chaplain and your present Major ably instructed you in during your last camp, and the ministers of your various churches set before you in their addresses; and I am persuaded that you all believe the words they spoke to you, because I hold the conviction that boys when they have the doctrines of true manhood placed before them do believe them more readily than some people are inclined to think.

In the second place, I want to say to you as boys of the Brigade in P. E. I. that all I know of you has quite justified all that we could have expected of you. To me it was a touching moment when just as we were about to march out of our camping ground your Colonel found it in his heart to say that he never in his life before, believed it possible to undertake the keeping of 200 boys in camp for a week—boys taken from all ranks of society and all kinds of homes—and be able to say at the end of that period that he had not discovered one bad boy among the number. That was an honorable record for the boys of your Province. Will ye not learn to estimate that word of commendation at its true value? Will ye not feel that there now rests upon the whole Battalion a noblesse oblige? Will ye not see to it that high character shall follow you so long at least as your membership in the Brigade shall continue? If ye do this I do not fear for your influence upon the future of your country and I have no fear for the future boys of the Brigade with such an example to emulate.

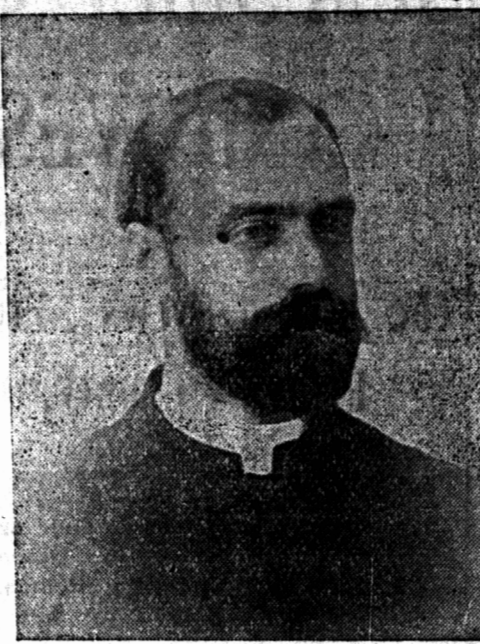
