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PAINFUL INJURY.—Little Clifford MacLeod, seven year old son of Mr. and Mrs. John E. MacLeod, Irishtown, is a patient in the Prince County Hospital, Summerside, with a badly injured face, resulting from a kick by a foal he was driving. He had gone with his young aunt, Edna MacLeod to bring cows and horses from pasture. The accident happened late Tuesday afternoon and the little fellow walked almost a half mile to reach his home. His mother was attending the fair, and his grand parents, noting that a cut across his lips was bleeding profusely rushed him to the hospital. On examination it was found that the bone directly beneath the eye is crushed, that the skin is not broken and the eye is best. Due to the situation of the injuries treatment is difficult.—Bur.
