COL. PRINGLE IN CALIFORNIA.—Referring to the recent visit of Col. Pringle to California, the Oakland Maple Leaf says: Lieutenant Colonel the Rev Dr Pringle, pastor of St Andrew's church, Sydney, Nova Scotia, was a recent visitor to the cities around San Francisco Bay and while in Oakland and Alameda gave a series of lectures on his experiences at the front, which were intensely interesting and largely attended. Colonel Pringle went overseas with the first Canadian contingent and served as Field Chaplain to the British Forces at the front during the entire period of the war. He spoke to an audience that taxed the capacity of the First Presbyterian Church of Oakland and thrilled his hearers by recounting his experiences at the front. He said the Allies had won the greatest victory of all time because of the righteousness of their cause, and Germans have suffered the most humiliating defeat of any nation in history. Incidents were given of the intense loyalty of the soldiers. In one great meeting of the Canadians at the front the display of a common Canadian map was the occasion of fifteen minutes of cheering and yelling. Colonel Pringle takes his audience right into his confidence. He even opened up his heart and showed his hearers just how God had comforted him at the death of his son, who was killed at the battle of the Somme. Chaplain Pringle is a native of Charlottetown and is a cousin of Mrs. Joseph Dingwell of Oakland. While here he was the guest of Mr. and Mrs. Dingwell.
