NEGOTIATIONS MAKE PROGRESS

Between Russia and Japan and may Succeed

Russia's Dominant Interest in Manchuria Conceded, but Japan Must Hold her Influence in Korea.

NEGOTIATIONS MAKING PROGRESS.

ST. PETERSBURG, Nov. 27.—(Special).—Russian and Japanese negotiations are proceeding steadily towards settlement. JAPAN MAKES A CONCESSION.

Japan recognises Russia's dominant interest in Manchuria while still maintaining the ultimate recognition of her treaty rights to open ports and the integrity of the Chinese sovereign.

MUST BE FIRST IN KOREA.

Japan also insists on the recognition of her influence in Korea and the opening of various ports to foreign trade.

WHAT RUSSIA OBJECTS TO.

Russia objects to opening Yongampo because of its proximity to the mouth of the Yalu River as threatening her interests and complicating the difficulties in Manchuria.

CAUGHT A FIRE BUG.

BOSTON, Nov. 25.—With the arrest of Michael Horrigan, of Charlottetown last night on a warrant charging arson, Deputy Fire Marshall Jas. B. Dunn thinks that he has been the cause of seven incendiary fires in Charlottetown since September 10, which have caused an aggregate damage of \$75,000.

KEPT GOOD FAITH.

LONDON, November 25.—The colonial office has received the following despatch from Premier Seddon of New Zealand: "The preferential trade bill was passed in the House of Representatives by a vote of 80 to 10, and in the Legislative Council practically unanimously.
