ELECTION DAY.

The time for argument, for declamation, for the presentation of facts and figures, and of charges and rebuttal in the election is past. A great array of counsel has been heard on both sides, but there has been no impartial judge to sum up the evidence apply the law and direct the jury as to what is extraneous and what is pertinent to the issue, and generally to set the case clearly before their minds. This is regrettable, but also inevitable. It is the more regrettable because the babel of tongues heard during the trial may tend almost as much to confuse the issue and to cloud the minds of the jury as to instruct and enlighten them.

But there is still good reason to hope that the verdict will be in the main a fair and just one. The Canadian people are intelligent, and accustomed to elections. Most of them had their minds made up before the writs were issued or the political campaign was begun. It is not probable that very many have changed their opinions on account of what they read or heard during the period of discussion. The tumult and the shouting of the contest might have been omitted without greatly changing the final result. The verdict given at the polls to-day will be mainly a considered and deliberate one on the part of the many who vote, even while those who may make up their minds too hastily, or upon insufficient grounds, will divide and balance each other.

What Tennyson has spoken of as "the common sense of most" is a very real thing in the world, and guides many to right conclusions, which they may not be able to logically account for. Above all we believe the great mass of the Canadian people are patriotic and loyal. They love their country and seek its welfare. They know that they must share its fortunes for good or ill. And these men, having had a Sabbath's repose between the noisy campaign and the day of polling, will enter the ballot box with some sense of responsibility for the duty of the hour. They may be in some cases misguided or mistaken, but we feel that their verdict will be entitled to respect, whether it shall be found to accord with our own judgement or otherwise.

Both are patriotic men of clean lives. That is of itself a great thing and something of which in these days of scandal we all may be proud.

COMING EVENTS.

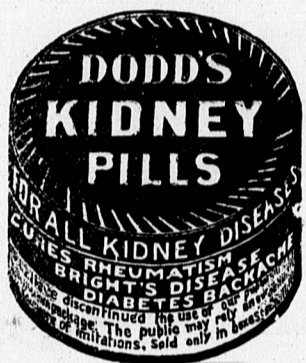
Red Rose Meeting, Lodge Prince Edward S. O. E. Tuesday, November 10th.

The Reform League on consultation with Premier Hazzard and Mr. Matheson, leader of the Opposition has been assured by both of them that they are in hearty sympathy with the objects of the League, and pledge themselves to do all in their power to secure a clean provincial election.

We are pleased to learn that the Reform League have received highly satisfactory reports from the different polling divisions in Queen's County and neither money nor whiskey are in evidence as in former elections. There is a general impression that the election will be the cleanest for many years.

It is our boast that in our sports and pastimes the games and competitions are conducted in a fair, manly and impartial manner. It is doubly important that the national election of today shall be conducted honorably, fairly and legally on both sides. This is of more consequence than the success of either party.

A feature of the newspaper campaign in the election has been the purchase of two newspapers by the Government party in St. John on the eve of the contest, and the comparative silence or neutrality of two formerly strong organs of Conservative opinion in the west, The Montreal Star and the Toronto World. The founding of a new Conservative journal in St. John, The Standard, and the transfer of the Toronto News from the independent to the Conservative column has partially balanced these losses, and it will be of interest to note hereafter what effect if any the changed attitude of the press has had upon the general result.

HUBBARD SQUASH AND PUMPKINS.

Hubbard squash is not used to the extent that it should be in this country. In England and the United States this vegetable is very much prized. As a vegetable it is unexcelled and for pie making it is all that could be desired. Pumpkins, is another vegetable coming more into use every year, and a good pumpkin pie goes to the right spot every time. Then again pumpkins make grand preserves, a 20c. pumpkin will produce as much preserve as one dollar's worth of plums. Cranberries should be used more extensively than they are, they correct the liver and have a beneficial effect on the kidneys and purify the blood.

It would be exasperating to give all this information if we were not in a position to point out where to procure those articles and at a very reasonable figure.

Hubbard squash we have them at from 10 to 20c. each. Pumpkins we have them from 10 to 25c. each. Cranberries we have them (as good as Cape Cod's some say better) at 8c per quart 10 quarts for 75c. All the above goods advance in price as the season advances and have done so year after year as long as we can remember.
