RANG JOY BELLS LITTLE TOO SOON

OSWEND, Aug. 28.—The birth of a son to the Princess Albert of Belgium was received by the governor of Bruges lately. Thereupon the bells of the cathedral were set ringing, public and other buildings were draped with flags, and the newspapers issued special editions announcing that the future of the reigning dynasty was assured, the princess already having two sons. The governor also addressed in the name of the province a long telegram of felicitations to Prince Albert, who is King Leopold's nephew. An hour later a dispatch was received from the Prince's side-camp thanking the governor for the evidence of attachment to the dynasty displayed in his telegram, but adding that the event to which it referred had not yet taken place.

MONARCHS ARE IN DANGER ZONE

LONDON, Aug. 28.—Reynold's News-paper, the most sensational journal in London, says it learns "on authority that places the authenticity of the statement beyond any possibility of doubt that two anarchists of the most desperate type were seen at Southampton during the regatta week, with the undoubted intention of making an attempt on the life of King Alfonso by hurling a bomb at him while he was ashore on the Isle of Wight. Detectives were aware of the presence of the anarchists, though, and were able to frustrate their plans.

DOMINION EXHIBITION.

On a Scale of Magnificence.
