LONGUEUIL, Aug. 28.—Horace Marcille, carpenter by trade and one of the old residents was found by his wife in the stable suffering from a paralytic stroke. THE SUGGESTION OF PEACE LEAGUE.

LONDON, August 28.—The Daily News today publishes a communication stating the origin of the Colonel Theodore Roosevelt's famous suggestion for an European peace league, made at Christiania during his recent tour of Europe, was a memorandum prepared on the subject by the king of Italy, which the king asked Colonel Roosevelt to convey to Emperor William of Germany.

It was before the Nobel Prize Commission at Christiania in his address on "International Peace" that Colonel Roosevelt made his plea for a league of peace. "It would be a masterpiece," he stated, "if those great powers honestly bent on peace, not only to keep the peace among themselves, but to prevent, by force if necessary, it being broken by others."

HUNTING TREASURE IN NOVA SCOTIA

AMHERST, N. S., Aug. 28.—The treasure hunting fever has laid violent hands upon this town, and scores of residents are digging industriously at various points in the hope of unearthing some hidden wealth. Fort Lawrence, the historic grounds near here, is the Mecca of a number of excursions for pick and shovel armed searchers.

The idea has been entertained that the French, who at one time occupied this isthmus, deposited their silverware and money in hiding places at the time of their expulsion and there have been, too, many stories about money being sent here at the time of the American Revolution, to be used for the purpose of undermining the loyalty of the Nova Scotians to the British Crown.

A vacant residence in town has lately acquired the reputation of having money concealed within its walls. The owner paid a visit to this house the other day and was surprised to find a large portion of the plaster, laths and base board removed. It appears that a lady visitor in Amherst, before coming here had had a vision and in her dreams had seen the house in question and had located exactly where the money was hidden. A mineral rod was called into play and it pointed to the place designated by the lady who had seen the vision, but no money was found.

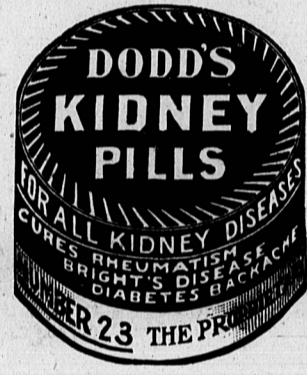
GRAND AIR MANOEUVRES.

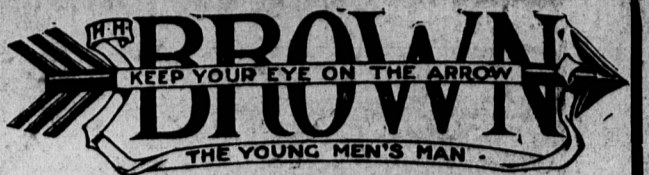
