THE ROOSEVELT STILL AT BATTLE HARBOR.

NEW YORK, Sept. 15.—Commander Peary has assumed a less aggressive attitude toward Dr. Cook. With Cook beyond the reach of wireless on the ocean, the flame of the North Pole controversy must be fed by the supporters of two explorers rather than by the principals themselves. Cook has held his tongue all along with the assurance that he would "make good," when the time came. When interviewed yesterday, Peary declined to enter into further debate "until Cook has issued a full authorized statement." At the same time the Commander emphatically reaffirmed that "I am the only white man who ever reached the North Pole."

Special prizes have for years been given by some citizens. One firm in particular, Carter & Co., Limited, have contributed liberally in order to encourage the growing of certain field crops, the seed of which they make a specialty. This year they are again to the front, as will be seen by reference to the Prize List. In offering large cash prizes for turkeys and mangel seed from seed supplied by them or their agents. In past years the competition was open to all, and most of the prizes were taken by gardeners and others within the limits of the City. Many farmers complained that this was unfair, as they could not compete against gardeners who planted only a small quantity especially for exhibition purposes, whereas the farmer had to make his selection for competition from a field of perhaps several acres. This year Carter & Co. in deference to the farmers have excluded all competition within the City limits, and it is to be hoped that the farmers will take advantage of this and make a good showing in Carter & Co's exhibit.
