NEW YORK, May 1-(AP)—Stocks and bonds took back seats in today's market while speculative attention again centered on climbing commodities.

Losses were registered among Canadian issues. Biggest loser was Bell Telephone down four points to 101 and Distillers Seagram pld down 1-1-8.

The Associated Press average of 60 stocks finished unchanged at 39.2. Transfers of 310,040 shares were the smallest for a full session since March 5, and compared with 468,350 the day before.

McKesson and Robbins pld got up 1-1-8 to a new 1941 top. Other gainers included U.S. Steel, Standard Oil of N.J., Kennecott, Santa Fe, Montgomery Ward, United Aircraft, U.S. Rubber and Loft.

TORONTO, May 1-(CP)—New low prices for the year were registered by three index groups today on the Toronto stock exchange.

Volcan was down to \$2,000 shares. Imperial Oil weakened slightly to 7-8 but recovered with trading quite heavy in the issue and the close was down slightly for Brazillian, Canadian Car, Distillers Seagrams, Fanny Farmer and Dominion Stores.

The shares of Standard Radio were called for trading for the first time today and they sold at 2-1-2 to 2-3-4, closing at the higher figure. These shares replace Rogers-Majestic on the board.

Soft spots in the goods involved Aunor, Bralorne, McKenzie, Preston, San Antonio and Teck Hughes while the tone was a bit stronger for Little Long Lac, Wright-Harvesters and Sylvanite.

Hudson Bay came out in volume at a loss of 7-8 to 24-3-4. Smelters held unchanged. Loss of 10 cents for Waite-Amulet to 3-20 was the main change in the cheaper base metal list.
