AMSTERDAM, (via London) Jan. 20. According to the Handelsblad, Emperor William has issued an order that the untrained German reservists no longer shall be permitted to serve as guards of honor at the burials of prisoners of war. "As much as he would like to give deceased prisoners of war the last military honors," the order of the Emperor, is quoted as saying, "all considerations must give way to the main work of these troops, namely, the acquisition as quickly as possible of the necessary military training."
