Owing to the emigration movement
 to Canada, farm servants in Scotland
 are scarce and farmers have to pay
 higher wages.

White Blackbird Captured
 A young man caught a perfectly
 white blackbird recently near Donegal.
 It is of the male species, and is now
 domesticated in a cage.

114 Years Old
 The death occurred of Mr. Bryan
 O'Donnell, farmer, Inver, Donegal, at
 the age of 114. Deceased, whose
 faculties remained unimpaired to the
 last, could speak Irish only.

Died in Her 101st Year
 The death occurred of Mrs. Lucy
 Blyth, Moffat, in her 101st birthday.
 She had resided in Moffat for sixty-
 seven years. She was predeceased by
 her husband twenty-four years.

Oldest Church Treasurer
 Mr. Robert Smellie, the world's
 church treasurer, died at Langholm
 in his ninety-fourth year. He had
 been treasurer of Langholm Free
 Church since the Disruption in 1843,
 and had collected money for the Free
 Church cause before the Disruption.
 He had been treasurer of the church
 for seventy years.

Swimming in Porter
 At Ladyswell Brewery, Cork, a vat
 of porter, with a capacity of 560 bar-
 rels of thirty-six gallons, burst, the
 contents rushing like a flood through
 the brewery yard and into the cellars.
 A workman had a narrow escape and
 had to swim through the escaping
 liquid.

Time Limit for Marriage
 In connection with an order made by
 the Clones Rural District Council that
 a laborer should leave his cottage if
 he did not marry within a month, an
 amusing letter was read at the last
 meeting protesting that it was not pos-
 sible to find a suitable partner within
 the time limit, and asking how many
 of the Board, "young or antique," made
 up their minds to marry in a month.

"Dismissed Policeman"
 William Barrett claimed exemption
 from the jury service at the Belfast
 Assizes on the ground that he was a
 dismissed policeman. Lord Justice
 Cherry said that was no disqualifica-
 tion, but Mr. Barrett said that a late
 Attorney-General for Ireland had
 stated that the word of a dismissed
 policeman could not be relied on.
 The Crown ordered him to "stand by."

Parade of Female Strikers
 A curious scene was witnessed in
 Londonderry when a large crowd of
 factory girls on strike marched to a
 "penny bazaar," where they bought
 penny trumpets, bicycle bugles, and
 motor horns. At the dinner hour
 they formed in procession and marched
 from the Labor Rooms to the factory,
 blowing the trumpets and hooters, and
 altogether making a deafening noise.

Smart Dodge That Failed
 An ingenious device to evade the
 law was related by Sergeant Duggan
 at Swinford Petty Sessions. A man
 charged under the Lights on Vehicles
 Act, spying the police in the distance,
 took his donkey from the cart, and
 getting between the shafts, pulled it
 along himself. He protested that he
 had committed no offence, as a man
 with a wheelbarrow was not obliged
 to carry a light. The Bench imposed
 a fine, thereby showing that they held
 a different view of the case.

"Save the Language"
 The Gaelic League issued its annual
 appeal for aid in the work of support-
 ing the Irish language to which it has
 set itself, and for which it has al-
 ready done so much. The census, it
 is pointed out, reveals that while Irish
 shows a uniform advance in pros-
 perous parts of the country, Ulster
 and Leinster having converted a for-
 mer loss of 2,000 speakers a year into
 a now continuous gain of 1,400 a year,
 yet these gains are not enough to com-
 pensate the continuing drain from the
 more Irish-speaking districts. "To
 save the language," the appeal says,
 the efforts of the League "must be
 redoubled—probably quadrupled."

Wife and a Job Wanted
 An amusing letter was read at Ros-
 common Guardians' meeting, in which
 a laborer asked to be supplied with
 "a partner for life," stating that he
 had "suffered thirty-five winters sin-
 gle." "I could do with any of the
 girls in the 'House,'" continued the
 missive, "a warden, maid, cook, nurse,
 or anything, and if you grant my re-
 quest I will save the ratepayers hun-
 dreds of pounds. I will go in and live
 in the 'House' and make myself gen-
 erally useful by keeping the bottles
 empty and well washed. You will want
 no more contracts for potatoes, as I
 will till the master's flower garden.
 I could also act in the capacity of
 schoolmaster, and give the guardians
 that come in at eleven o'clock instruc-
 tion in etymology, prosody, syntax,
 and verbosity, so as to help the re-
 porters."
