Trusting as an old friend—it never fails to please with its lasting flavour. (By The Canadian Press) LONDON, July 15.—The remains of John N. P. Bennett, who was found dead in the Canadian Rocky Mountains after he had been missing for seven months, were brought back to his home at Coventry recently for burial in Allesley churchyard. Bennett, who was 19 years of age left Coventry for Canada a year ago. He died in trying to cross the Rockies alone from North Alberta to Prince George, British Columbia. He was more than half way when he sank exhausted in the snow.

Preference In Australian Market

Canada Gets a British Preferential Tariff on 415 Out of 433 Items in the Australian Tariff Schedules. (Canadian Press) MONTREAL, Que., July 15.—(Livestock)—There were only 25 calves, 9 lambs and 356 hogs and 38 cattle offered for sale on the two Montreal stockyards today, including 20 or more hogs held over from Monday and Tuesday. 425 cattle were in the yards for export to Birkenhead to be loaded on the Manchester Producer Thursday, making 836 export cattle for the week.

Increased Preference on Newsprint and Motor Cars. An increased preference from \$15 under the old agreement to \$20 per ton is received on newsprint. Canada last year sold \$4,000,000 worth of newsprint out of Australia's total import of \$11,000,000. Canada gets an increased advantage on motor cars chassis un-assembled. The former rate was 22-1/2 percent against Canada, and under the new agreement the rate will only be 15 percent. While the general tariff was formerly 27-1/2 percent, it is now 32-1/2 percent, which applies to the United States. This country shipped \$3,000,000 of motor car chassis un-assembled to Australia last year, while the United States exported \$16,500,000 to the Antipoden country. The tariff change in favor of Canada is expected to greatly increase Canadian exports of motor car chassis un-assembled.
